VEHICLE NON-COMPLIANCES

PBS observation data has identified an increase in vehicle non-compliances on site including driving while using mobile devices and drivers not adhering to the speed limits on site.

Speeding does not increase your ability to arrive on time, but increases your chances of not arriving at all. Is speeding worth it to arrive a few seconds earlier than normal?

DAILY COVID-19 MESSAGES PROXIMITY EXPECTATIONS

If you are sent home to self-isolate because you were evaluated as being in close proximity to someone who has been tested for COVID-19 you need to follow the below instructions.

1. **If the test of the person you were in close proximity to comes back negative**, you will be asked to return to work no later than your next scheduled shift. You should receive a phone call or text within 2-5 days with return-to-work instructions.
2. **If the person you were in close proximity with tests positive**, you will be given the option to have a COVID-19 test at the on-site clinic no earlier than the day you are informed of the results. You will also remain in isolation for a minimum of 14 days. You will receive a phone call or text to return to work at the end of the 14 days. If you develop symptoms, call the flu hotline.
3. If your courtesy test is positive, at the end of your 14-day quarantine you must go to the building 140 medical clinic to be screened prior to entering the site.

Q: If I am a proximity person and I take the test for COVID and it is negative, can I come back to work?

A: No, you still have to quarantine for 14 days off site.

Vehicle non-compliances

July 28, 2020

PBS observation data has identified an increase in vehicle non-compliances on site including drivers using mobile devices while driving and drivers not adhering to the speed limit on site.

Drivers using mobile devices while driving

In recent weeks, an increased number of workers were observed using a mobile device while driving vehicles, gators, ATVs, and buggies on site. **This is not a safe practice.** According to statistics released by dmv.org, 26% of all mobile accidents are a result of cell phone use. **Do not use your PTT or cell phone while driving on site.**

July 11-17	23% non-compliant
July 4-10	8% non-compliant
June 27-3 July	18% non-compliant
June 20-26	16% non-compliant

Drivers not adhering to the speed limit

There have also been observations with vehicles driving above the posted speed limit. The speed limit on site is 15 mph unless otherwise posted. Always adhere to vehicle speed signs, monitors, and pedestrian crossings across the site. Observing posted speed signs while operating vehicles, gators, ATVs, and buggies will help to keep you and your teammates safe.

Date	Percentage of at-risk behaviors according to PBS observations in drivers not adhering to the speed limit
July 4-10	8% non-compliant
June 27-3 July	12% non-compliant

Site policy states that, drivers found violating site vehicle or driving procedures and placing people, plant, or equipment at risk, may lose driving privileges and/or site vehicle may be reassigned or removed from site.
