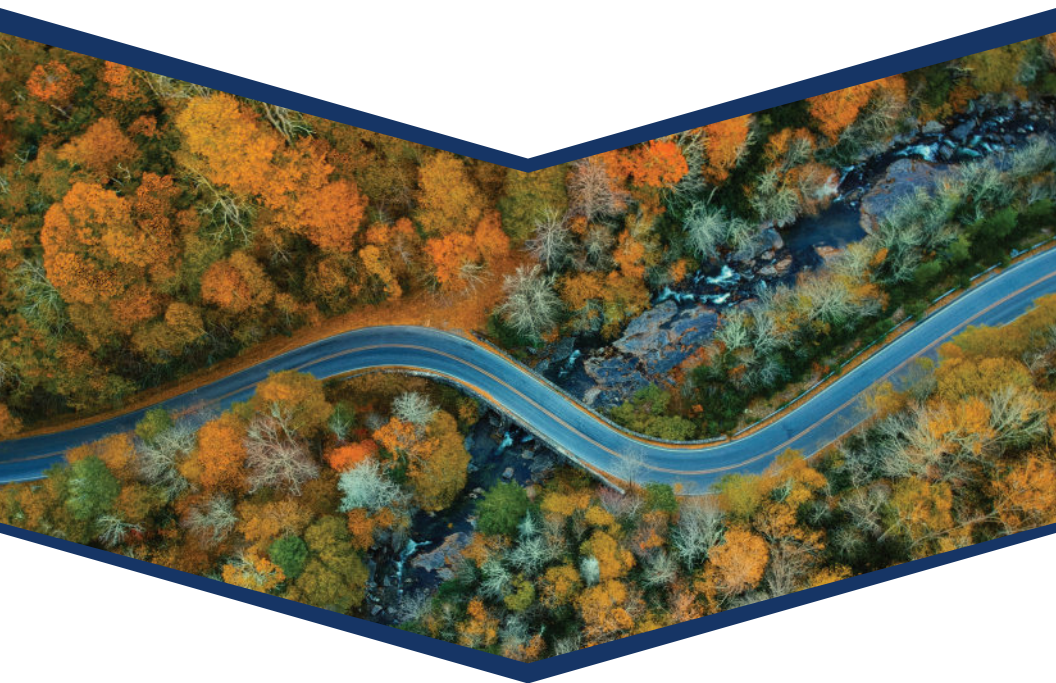

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Opening Keynote

Joel Moxley

President & CEO – National GPA



Joel Moxley is president and CEO of GPA Midstream Association, and CEO of GPSA, our related midstream supplier's organization. He is responsible for the strategic leadership of the organizations.

Prior to his appointment to lead the associations in 2019, Moxley worked in the midstream industry at a variety of companies including executive positions at Southcross, Crestwood, Crosstex, Enterprise, El Paso, PG&E and Valero. He has had responsibilities ranging from engineering and operations to corporate development, HR and IT over his 40+ year career.

Moxley had been involved with GPA Midstream as a member and volunteer long before he was appointed CEO. His association involvement began with the Houston GPA Midstream chapter in the mid-90s, and over time, led to serving on and leading many committees within the national organization. He served as GPA Midstream chairman of the board from 2013 – 2015. As president and CEO, he has moved the organizations to take more active positions in Federal advocacy, led GPA Midstream's efforts to develop an ESG reporting template and pushed to increase the midstream industry's visibility through the Let's Clear the Air campaign.

Harold Rinehart

VP of Operations – Marathon



Harold is Vice President of Operations for MPLX Gathering and Processing. He has over thirty years of experience within the midstream oil and gas industry. Harold is a graduate of the University of Findlay with a Bachelor of Science degree in Environmental and Hazardous Materials Management. He started with Marathon Pipe Line Company in 1991 as an Environmental professional in rural Illinois. He progressed through multiple roles in both Operations and Health Environmental and Safety (HES) supervision within Marathon Petroleum Company (MPC) organizations including Marketing, Terminals, Transport, Marine and Rail. Harold became the HES Manager for MPC's Logistics and Storage (L&S) organization in 2013 where he was responsible for leading HES performance improvement across the four MPC midstream operating organizations.

In 2016 Harold became the Operations & Logistics Manager for Marathon Pipe Line company. He was responsible for Marathon's Pipeline Operations, the Control Center, SCADA, Field Controls, Automation, Hydraulics Engineering, Measurements, Scheduling and Revenue Analysis for approximately 7,000 miles of mainline Liquids pipelines. He left this role in 2019 for his role as Vice President, HES leading efforts in Personal and Process Safety, Environmental, PHMSA, Security and Sustainability for MPLX gas gathering and processing operations nationwide.

In 2023 Harold took his current role as the VP of Operations for MPLX Gathering and Processing East Region. His responsibilities include all operations in Ohio, Pennsylvania, West Virginia and Kentucky. This area has a capacity of 8.6 BCFD gas processing, 350,000 BPD ethane recovery, 470,000 BPD C3+ fractionation and 2,000 miles of gas and liquids pipelines with approximately 400,000 HP of compression.

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
