Emergency Operations Center Activated in Anticipation of Potential Flooding – As the potential for flooding increased and the National Weather Service issued a Flood Warning for the Guadalupe River area and a Flash Flood Watch for Ross Creek, the City of San José issued evacuation notices in the evening of February 13. Notices were provided via door to door notification, text messaging, and voice recording. This included a ‘prepare to evacuate’ message communicated by knocking on doors in the affected areas, and through text message and voice recordings in three languages – English, Spanish and Vietnamese. As the waters receded after peaking at just below flood levels and the rains lessened, and after consulting with the National Weather Service and Valley Water, the City rescinded the evacuation order around 7:00 a.m. on February 14. The City and Valley Water will continue to monitor conditions throughout the holiday weekend and will have staff available to respond as necessary. San José City Hall and Other City Offices Holiday Closure – In observance of the Presidents’ Day holiday, San José City Hall and other City offices will be closed Monday, February 18. All City offices will reopen on Tuesday, February 19. The San José Police and Fire Departments, along with other critical City services, will remain unaffected by the closure. Overnight Warming Locations in San José to Open February 15-19 – Due to the current cold and wet weather, the City of San José is activating three [Overnight Warming Locations](#) (OWLs) for our homeless residents. The OWLs will be open for four nights from Friday, February 15th through Tuesday, February 19th (closing on Tuesday morning). Our OWLs provide potentially life-saving refuge from the elements for people who may have nowhere else to turn. The three OWL sites being activated are Leininger Community Center (1300 Senter Road), Bascom Community Center (1000 S. Bascom Ave.) and Roosevelt Community Center (901 E. Santa Clara Street). 

February 21, 2019, 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. – The next meeting of the California High-Speed Rail Authority's San José Community Working Group will take place on Thursday, February 21, at the Edenvale Branch Library, 101 East Branham Lane. The Working Group, which comprises representatives from several resident, business, and community-based organizations, meets quarterly. Meetings are open to the public. Participants hear the latest developments and provide input on progress toward the 520-mile high-speed train system, which will cross San José with over 20 miles of track and help make Diridon Station one of the busiest transit hubs in the west. Staff from the Authority will give a presentation explaining how they will pick a preferred track alignment option from the several alternatives being studied in an environmental impact report and introduce attendees to Deutsche Bahn, the "early train operator," which will be assisting with the early planning for train operations. The Department of Transportation works closely with the

California High-Speed Rail Authority and encourages interested members of the public to participate in this and future meetings.
