WARRIORS COMMUNITY FOUNDATION, PEPSICO AND CITY OF SAN JOSE SET TO UNVEIL REFURBISHED COURT AT SEVEN TREES COMMUNITY CENTER

**Seven Trees Community Center Refurbished Court Marks The Warriors Community Foundation's 80th Court
Refurbishment Project In The Bay Area, Dating Back To 1999
Court Dedication Ceremony With Warriors Guard Quinn Cook To Begin At 3:30 On February 11**

OAKLAND, Calif. – The back-to-back NBA Champion Golden State Warriors, along with PepsiCo, Creative Sports Concepts and the City of San José, will unveil the Warriors' 80th refurbishment project, a streak that began in March of 1999 at Brookdale Park in Oakland. The 80th court will be unveiled at the Seven Trees Community Center in San José on Monday, February 11, it was announced today. **Photos of the first-ever Warriors Community Foundation court refurb can be found [HERE](#).**

Warriors guard Quinn Cook will be in attendance for the court unveil ceremony, which will begin at 3:30 at Seven Trees Community Center, located at 3590 Cas Drive in San José, and will be followed by a basketball clinic, hosted by Warriors Basketball Camp, from 4:00 to 5:00.

The basketball court at the City's Department of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services' (PRNS) Seven Trees Community Center was refurbished in partnership with the Warriors, PepsiCo and Creative Sports Concepts as part of the Makin' Hoops program, which has restored 80 basketball courts in the Bay Area. The renovation work included a refinished basketball court surface with new lines, including a San José center court logo, an NBA backboard, protective covers on the scoreboards and shot clocks, and a wall decal with basketball imagery. **An image of the Seven Trees Community Center court banner can be viewed [HERE](#).**

The newly refurbished court will further the PRNS mission to build healthy communities through people, parks and programs.
