**Required Book:** All students will read *Hatchet* by Gary Paulsen.

Also, you will read **one** additional novel from the list on the back of this page.

**Due Date:** First day of sixth grade


- 1. Your heading should include your first and last name, the date you completed your assignment and the words "Entering 6th grade" in the upper left corner of your paper.
- 2. Your report will include two parts, labeled on separate pages.

**Part I** Main events of *Hatchet* Sixth graders should be able to summarize key events in a story. (CCSS RL.6.2) As you read *Hatchet*, think about how you would summarize the novel to a friend. You will write 2-3 sentences that summarize the **beginning** of the story, 2-3 sentences that summarize events in the **middle**, and 2-3 sentences that summarize the **end** of the story.

- **3.** The paragraph should be written in your own words. **You should not copy words and/or phrases from the novel or from any other source**. Do not consult any outside sources in completing this assignment. This assignment should show your true writing ability.
- **4**. A paragraph should include 6-8 sentences. Be sure to use complete sentences. Use variety in the way you start your sentences.
- **5.** Your summer reading assignment should be **typed and double-spaced**. If you do not have access to a computer during the summer, please neatly write your report in blue or black ink on every other line of the paper. Work should be on only one side of the paper.
- **6.** Check your paper thoroughly for spelling and punctuation errors. Proofread!
- 7. Staple your paper in the upper left hand corner. No folders or cover sheets, please.
- **8.** Please bring your completed assignment on the first day of school in September.



## Summer Reading Project Evaluation Sheet

Hatchet B-M-E summaries (12 points)
Summaries cover events from the beginning, middle, and end of the bookSummaries accurately relate key and important eventsSummaries are brief, not summarizing the entire book
Character Award (13 points):
