


This Week on Martine

ESL Course Registration



We're happy to once again offer courses on English as a Second Language taught by professors from Westchester Community College's English Language Institute. This fall, we'll have three sections of the high beginner/low intermediate (3 & 4) levels. Books are required and must be purchased on the first day of class (cost of books is \$40, cash only).

Classes will run September through December with the following schedules:

- **Mon. & Wed. Mornings:** M/W, September 12—December 10, 10:15 am-1:15 pm (Skip 10/8, 11/12)
- **Mon. & Wed. Evenings:** M/W, September 12—December 12 5:50 pm-8:50 pm (Skip 10/8, 11/12, 11/21)
- **Saturday:** Sat. September 15—December 8, 10:15 am to 4:45 pm (Lunch 1:15 pm-1:45 pm) (Skip 11/24)

English level is determined by exam on the registration date. Students must go to one of the following registration sessions at the Library:

- **Saturday, August 25, from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm**
- **Wednesday, August 29 from 10:15 am to 12:15 pm**
- **Wednesday, August 29 from 5:15 pm to 7:15 pm**

Registration is on the second floor of the Library.

WCC Fee: \$20 (no cash) via credit or debit card (Mastercard / Visa / Discover), money order or check.

If you or someone you know is interested in basic level ESL classes, BOCES will offer a class at the Library on Mondays-Thursdays running from September through December. Registration for this class will be held on the first day of class Wednesday, September 12 at 10:00 a.m. There is a one-time registration fee of \$25.

Jazz Jam with Art Bennett





What White Plains is Reading



[***The Banker's Wife*** by Cristina Alger](#)

On an early morning in November, a couple boards a private plane bound for Geneva, flying into a storm. Soon after, it simply drops off the radar, and its wreckage is later uncovered in the Alps. Among the disappeared is Matthew Werner, a banking insider at Swiss United, a powerful offshore bank. His young widow, Annabel, is left grappling with the secrets he left behind, including an encrypted laptop and a shady client list.




[***Chariot on the Mountain*** by Jack Ford](#)

"The stunning travails of Kitty Payne, an actual Virginia slave who was freed and then kidnapped by her master's nefarious nephew, come to life in this suspenseful and affecting novel from Ford (*The Walls of Jericho*). Following the death of her master (who fathered her with another slave),

Kitty believes because she sell her and her


her life and the lives of her three children are in jeopardy, thinks that without the master's protection, his wife might children and break up her family." —*Publisher's Weekly*



[***Ghosted*** by Rosie Walsh](#)

When Sarah meets Eddie, they connect instantly and fall in love. To Sarah, it seems as though her life has finally begun. And it's mutual: It's as though Eddie has been waiting for her, too. Sarah has never been so certain of anything. So when Eddie leaves for a long-booked vacation and promises to call from the airport, she has no cause to doubt him. But he

doesn't call. Sarah's friends tell her to forget about him, but she can't. She knows something's happened--there must be an explanation.



[*Hope Never Dies* by Andrew Shaffer](#)

"Here's something different: a mystery novel not a pastiche or a parody, an actual proper mystery starring and narrated by former vice president Joe Biden and his sidekick, Barack Obama. This is not a joke. The book has its light moments, but overall it's a straight mystery. A man dies under especially nasty circumstances; Biden, who knew the man, is suspicious. He doesn't believe the things people are saying about the dead man, and he's determined to find out what really happened. Aided by his former boss, the charismatic Obama, Biden wades into a conspiracy that threatens the stability of the country." —*Booklist*
