
The First Lesson A Reading from the Prophet Isaiah (60:1-6)

Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. The Second Lesson A Reading from the Letter to the Ephesians, (3:1-12) This is the reason that I, Paul, am in jail for Jesus Christ for your sake. You have already heard about my responsibility to share God's grace to everyone—no exceptions. The mystery of Christ was made known to me by revelation, so that you could see it for yourselves.

The people who lived before Jesus Christ did not know this mystery, but it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by God's Spirit. The mystery is that everyone has equal value in God's eyes: people who have never heard of God and those who have heard of God all their lives. The Gospel has become my life's work because of the grace that God showed me in this message.

Although I am the least qualified messenger, this grace was given me
To preach the boundless riches of Christ, and to make everyone see the plan hidden for ages by God
who created all things. God's purpose is now to show all rulers, on earth and in the heavens, the
wisdom that is revealed through the Church.

This is consistent with the plan that God had from the beginning of time, and that he accomplished through Jesus Christ our Lord. When we trust in Christ, we can speak boldly, and we can go before God with confidence.

The Gospel: The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to Matthew (2:1-12)

All: Glory to You Lord Christ.

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem was also frightened. Calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he asked where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; For from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel. 'Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.
