The First Lesson Deuteronomy 26:1-11

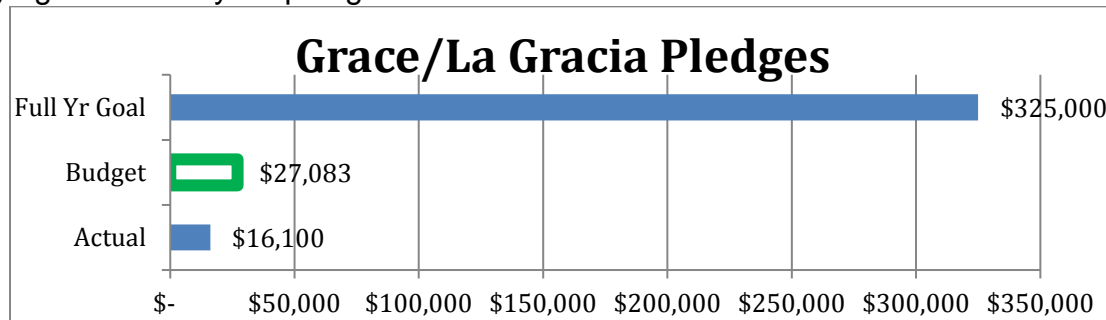
