## THE WORD OF GOD

**The First Lesson** A Reading from the Book of Numbers [11:4-6, 10-16, 24-29]

4 The rabble among them had a strong craving; and the Israelites also wept again, and said, 'If only we had meat to eat! <sup>5</sup>We remember the fish we used to eat in Egypt for nothing, the cucumbers, the melons, the leeks, the onions, and the garlic; <sup>6</sup>but now our strength is dried up, and there is nothing at all but this manna to look at.' . . . .

10 Moses heard the people weeping throughout their families, all at the entrances of their tents. Then the Lord became very angry, and Moses was displeased. <sup>11</sup>So Moses said to the Lord, 'Why have you treated your servant so badly? Why have I not found favor in your sight, that you lay the burden of all this people on me? <sup>12</sup>Did I conceive all this people? Did I give birth to them, that you should say to me, "Carry them in your bosom, as a nurse carries a sucking child", to the land that you promised on oath to their ancestors? <sup>13</sup>Where am I to get meat to give to all this people? For they come weeping to me and say, "Give us meat to eat!" <sup>14</sup>I am not able to carry all this people alone, for they are too heavy for me. <sup>15</sup>If this is the way you are going to treat me, put me to death at once—if I have found favor in your sight—and do not let me see my misery.'

16 So the Lord said to Moses, 'Gather for me seventy of the elders of Israel, whom you know to be the elders of the people and officers over them; bring them to the tent of meeting, and have them take their place there with you. . . .

24 So Moses went out and told the people the words of the Lord; and he gathered seventy elders of the people, and placed them all around the tent. <sup>25</sup>Then the Lord came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders; and when the spirit rested upon them, they prophesied. But they did not do so again.

26 Two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the spirit rested on them; they were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, and so they prophesied in the camp. <sup>27</sup>And a young man ran and told Moses, 'Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.' <sup>28</sup>And Joshua son of Nun, the assistant of Moses, one of his chosen men, said, 'My lord Moses, stop them!' <sup>29</sup>But Moses said to him, 'Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the Lord's people were prophets, and that the Lord would put his spirit on them!'

**Second Lesson:** A Reading from the Letter of James [5:13-20]

Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective. Elijah was a human being like us, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. Then he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain and the earth yielded its harvest.

My brothers and sisters, if anyone among you wanders from the truth and is brought back by another, you should know that whoever brings back a sinner from wandering will save the sinner's soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins.



# **Reports**

- ✓ Repairs have been scheduled at the Rectory, to be completed by the end of November
- ✓ Repairs to the elevator have been approved and will be completed by the spring of 2019.
- ✓ A 3-year timeline is in place for repair and refurbishment of the organ. Plans for funding are underway.
- ✓ Installation of a new comprehensive security system began this week.
- ✓ Steps are being taken for commercial cleaning of Grace's Kitchen, replacement of the kitchen door (donated by a parishioner), and a new exterminator for addressing rodent problems in the kitchen.
- ✓ The front fence has been repaired at no cost to Grace Church.
- ✓ Michael Heffner continues to refine enhanced audio-visual capability in the Sunday School classrooms, the Parish Hall, and the library; worship in the sanctuary can now be viewed in the parish hall and the library. All the new audio-visual equipment has been donated by parishioners.
- ✓ La Gracia's Fiesta on September 15th was a great success. The proceeds have been designated for the Grace La Gracia operating budget and for the Grace/La Gracia Sunday lunch program.
- ✓ Pledge income from La Gracia has increased over last year, even though it continues to be under budget for 2018.
- ✓ We will have two new The Episcopal Church Welcomes You signs: one at the corner of Church and Main has been hung; the second will be on Main Street closer to Renaissance Park.
- ✓ A New "Contacts List" has been posted on the bulletin boards and on the website to inform parishioners whom to call in emergencies and when they have general questions about specific topics.
- ✓ We have a Master Calendar for the 2018-2019 Program Year so that different groups can coordinate special events.
