Eligibility Criteria for City of Greensboro Homelessness Prevention Funding (Federal Community Development Block Grant and Emergency Solutions Grant and local Nussbaum Housing Partnership funds)


To be eligible to receive funding allocated by the City of Greensboro, an agency must meet these threshold standards:

- The agency and its services must be located within the Greensboro city limits
- The agency must have an IRS 501 (c) 3 designation letter verifying that it has existed as a non-profit for at least 2 years prior to the advertised due date for current year funding request
- The agency has no outstanding federal, state, or local tax obligations, has filed all required tax reports, and is not on the federal debarred contractors list
- Agencies providing Emergency Shelter or Transitional Shelter/Housing (excluding DV providers) must document that it tracks data and submits reports via a Homeless Management Information System. Domestic Violence and other programs must track data in HMIS or demonstrate capacity to provide equivalent data
- The agency must submit a statement defining how its program supports one of the City of Greensboro MAP goals. See attached.

Additional criteria that may be used by PEH in selecting new agencies and determining the funding amounts of all agencies include:

- Participation in Coordinated Entry and Coordinated Assessment
- Cost –effectiveness (number of people to be assisted for dollars received)
- Services to help clients move into permanent housing
- Performance in achieving successful outcomes for clients, particularly housing stability, and access to mainstream benefits
- Administrative costs relative to program costs
- Management of previous fund awards and justification for any new services and changes in budget from prior year
- New programs should present plans to sustain the program going forward

City of Greensboro funding for the coming fiscal year has not been determined at this time and is subject to federal, state, and local funding availability and to City Council consideration and final approval.
