Click on the Pay for College tab to access information on FAFSA, a financial aid calendar, the different types of financial aid, and much, much, more.

Here is where you complete your FAFSA form. Do not enter **fafsa.com**, or any **.com** version of this name, as it will direct you to scams and for-profit websites that will charge you for completing the form. Remember FAFSA stands for **Free** Application for Federal Student Aid. It's free, free, and free. If they ask for your money, run.

A few days after you submit your application you should receive your Student Aid Report (SAR). This is a summary of the information you entered on the FAFSA, and it will notify you of your Expected Family Contribution (EFC), and of whether you are eligible for a Pell Grant. **Check the information immediately!**
