Each summer, the City of Ames teams up with the ISU Office of Sustainability for the annual Rummage RAMPage event. This initiative aims to prevent reusable items from ending up in landfills while hosting a community rummage sale. Open to all for both donating and shopping, the event brings energy to the community through social connection and building a common identity toward a sustainable future. Organizing and completing such an event involves a lot of preparation and relies heavily on volunteers. In eight years of this event, the Ames community has energized the diversion of over 380 tons of household items from being landfilled and given energy to Ames, Iowa State University and Story County communities through providing nearly \$300,000 to non-profit and ISU student organizations in support of their missions, goals and initiatives.

This summer, 19 Iowa State University student organizations stepped up to energize and give energy to the 2024 Rummage RAMPage event. As these groups collaborated to bring the event to life, their dedication highlighted the spirit of community involvement and sustainability. From coordinating logistics to engaging with shoppers and donators, their efforts made an energizing difference. agribusinesses and even starting their own farming operations, all while carrying forward their passion for sustainable practices. The association also champions local food security by supporting [Food at First](#) (Ames' community free-meal program and food pantry), growing fresh produce for donation and hosting monthly community meals.

Since its inception in 2016, SASA has volunteered at Rummage RAMPage, viewing the event as an excellent opportunity to serve the community through waste reduction and helping valuable items find new homes. Members take pride in giving back to Ames while supporting local sustainability efforts, with proceeds reinvested into travel expenses for sustainable agriculture conferences like [Marbleseed](#) in Wisconsin.


