## Easter Continues!

Yes! Resurrection Sunday has come and gone, however, in the church, the Easter season continues throughout the month of May. Some of the scriptural themes for this Easter season are from:

- ◆ Acts, which follows the beginning of the church
- ◆ Revelation, which follows the fulfillment of the prophets and law in Jesus
- ◆ John, which follows Jesus, after His Resurrection, with his disciples, empowering them to prepare for their role in spreading the Gospel once Jesus ascends.

Speaking of Ascension, Ascension Day is on Thursday, May 26. Many of you relate this day as the day that Hilltop Acres Farm Market is closed, as our local Mennonite community keeps this as a holiday to celebrate Jesus' return to His Father after His resurrection. It is a day of rejoicing for Jesus; but is about waiting for the disciples as they await the coming of the Holy Spirit, which we will celebrate on Pentecost Sunday, June 5.

Below is an article from *Homiletics* published first in April 2003 which may help us, Jesus' disciples, with waiting:

### **There's something better coming**

This season of Easter is a special time for Christians to celebrate the ultimate reason for our hope: Christ is risen, and invites us to rise with him to new life.





## Geraniums for Pentecost


It's time once again to blanket the church in **RED** for Pentecost Sunday, June 5!



Benevolence: \$685 was received for Heifer Project; \$95 was received for One Great Hour of Sharing – both are March Missions of the Month.


Operating: income and expenses as expected.

### Christian Symbol

**ARK OF THE COVENANT**—For the Israelites, the Ark of the Covenant was at the center of worship. It contained the stone tablets of the Ten Commandments, a pot of manna and Aaron's rod. In the Old Testament, the ark was a visible representation of God's throne, or presence, on earth, where he communed with Moses and the high priests. It also represents our earthly bodies, where the Holy Spirit dwells.

- Adult help




**What you do:**
