Superimposed Love

Maybe you've heard how salvation is like a total solar eclipse: God doesn't see our sins because Jesus' holiness covers them completely. Or maybe you've heard how trials can cause an "eclipse of faith."

At WorldChallenge.org, Pastor Gary Wilkerson explains that in Greek, eclipse means "I am absent" or "I cease to exist," because people once thought the gods temporarily extinguished the sun. "For Christians, a 'spiritual eclipse' is a dark hour when God seems to be absent from our lives," Wilkerson writes.

Wilkerson points to Peter being sifted like wheat, Elijah and Jeremiah facing extreme discouragement, and David collapsing morally. Amid Satan's

attacks, "God seems completely absent," writes the pastor. "In that dark moment of eclipse, the devil has created such chaos we can't possibly see a way out." During times of testing, Christians must cry out to God and trust his faithfulness.

Completing the eclipse analogy, Wilkerson shares Titus 3:4, the "love of God our Savior appeared" (NIV). The Greek meaning of appeared here is superimposed, he writes. God looks on our fraught-filled times of eclipse and "superimposes his divine love over us."

Editor's note: A partial (90%) solar eclipse will be visible in Manheim on Monday, April 8 beginning at 2:06 pm. Please be safe in viewing the sun during this "dark hour."




Interested in Membership @ St. Paul's?



Church Council met on Tuesday, March 19, 2024 @ 7 pm. Please note that these highlights are shared before the minutes are approved by council at their next meeting, when corrections to details may occur.

Treasurer's Report:

Benevolence: \$1,396 was received for St. Paul's Shepherd's Fund which was the February Mission of the Month.

Operating: \$12,672 was received for current expenses in February, which is above budget.

Capital: \$5,370 (\$2,000 was the rental loan repayment) was received in February with no expenses for the month.

Pastor's Report:

- New members will be received 4 times/year – on Epiphany, Easter, Pentecost, and Reformation Sundays. If interested in membership, please see Pastor Bill Long.
- May 19 will be the outdoor Pentecost Sunday service with the picnic to follow. We will begin indoors for worship to accommodate live stream.
- Easter Sunday will feature 2 worship services: 8 am & 9:30 am with a continental breakfast in between the services.



New Business: Election of Officers was held. Current officers are: Karen Brandt, President; Rick Conley, Vice President; Gretchen Miller, Treasurer, and Mike Givler, Seceretary. To streamline, the position of Assistant Treasurer was eliminated and the Spiritual Council will meet only as needed. There will be no August council meeting.

Old Business: Council approved the congregational meeting minutes from January & December with no corrections needed. UCC Lancaster Association will meet here @ St. Paul's on Sunday, April 14.

Next meeting date is Tuesday, April 16 @ 6 pm.


