## The Forty Days Journey by Pastor Bill Long

No season of the church year invites us into a journey more than the Forty Days of Lent. What is this Lenten Journey? One description comes from the Prophet Joel. "For the Lord says "Return to me with all your heart...Rend your hearts and not your clothing." On our Journey into the heart of God we contend against anything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor.

On Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025, we begin our Forty Days of Journey toward Easter (April 20). We mark our foreheads with dust as we acknowledge that we die and return to earth. At the same time, the sign of the cross is marked on us reminding us to whom we belong. We have already been reconciled to God through Christ. We humbly pray for God to make our hearts clean while we rejoice that: "Now is the Day of Salvation." (2 Corinthians 6:2) Through Lent we return to our baptismal call to bear the fruits of God's love and mercy to our world.


Our Journey is also into Jesus' death and resurrection and into a renewal of our baptism into Christ.


# Healing & Community




# Spring Happenings @ St. Paul's





Church Council met on Tuesday, February 18, 2025. Below are highlights of that meeting. Please note that these highlights are shared before the minutes are approved by council at their next meeting, when corrections to details may occur.

### Treasurer's Report:

Benevolence: \$1,061 was received for UCC Homes, the January Mission of the Month (MOM). OCWM Giving was \$260 in January.

Operating: \$13,928 was received in January for current operating expenses.

Capital: \$1,300 was received for the capital fund with no expenditures in January.

- The Community Breakfast and Mission Team Leadership update was given.
- Pastor Bill Long's vacation schedule was approved as he lines up pastoral leadership for those dates.
- The August council meeting will be cancelled.
- Pastor Bill updated council on church members in the hospital.

**Old Business:** An update was given on the potential sale of the 32-34 N. Main Street property

**New Business:** New Voices and Council will combine for a meeting to be held on April 15.

Council approved using an online bill payment program through Fulton Bank for the Operating Fund checking account. Any expenditures \$5,000 and above will require a physical check with two approved signatures.




