On Thursday, May 21st, the Church celebrated Ascension Day. On Sunday, May 31st, the Church celebrated Pentecost at Drive in Worship. As I think about these things, the question comes to my mind, over what does Jesus reign? So, I went to our great Reformed Document, “*The Heidelberg Catechism*” and I came across this:

- ◆ Christ is our chief Prophet
- ◆ Our high Priest
- ◆ Our Eternal King

All right, what does that mean?

Only He can make a perfect 

As our chief Prophet, Christ reveals to us the will of God for our deliverance. As our high Priest, Christ has set us free by His sacrifice on the cross, and as our flesh in Heaven, He continually pleads our cause with God, the father. As our eternal King, Christ governs us by His Word and Spirit.

So, you see as our chief Prophet, Christ speaks and he is the word! “*In the beginning was the word and the word was with God...and the word became flesh and dwells with us.*” – John 1

As our high Priest, our Lord prayed, “This is my body broken for you, this is my blood shed for you.” Christ is the offering.

Covid 19 Update

In response to Gov. Wolf's directive to close all non-essential stores in PA as an effort to limit exposure to Covid 19, St. Paul's UCC will continue to honor Gov. Wolf's directive and **cancel all church activities, except Drive In Worship, effective immediately until further notice.**

A determination re: future worship services and events will be made when Lancaster County moves out of the red phase into the yellow and then green phases of reopening as we monitor the news about the spread of the disease and its severity as well as official recommendations about how best to safely respond. Feel free to check our website often for updates.

In the meantime, we will continue to communicate through this newsletter, email and our website. If you would like to receive our email updates, please contact the church office at 717.665.2447.

Drive in Worship services have begun on Sundays at 8:30 am & 10 am in St. Paul's UCC's parking lot (see page 3 for more information) as a safe alternative to regular worship. Sermons are still available online on

our website. So far our online sermons have been reaching between 80-100 views!

If you need Pastoral Care, please contact the church office at 717.665.2447. Please note that due to Covid-19, only end of life visitation is currently permitted in hospitals and nursing facilities. Therefore, most visitation will be done by phone.

Looking ahead as we prepare to meet again, please be ready for church to be affected by social distancing guidelines, as the virus will still be around with no cure or vaccine widely available for some time. Please be assured that St. Paul's will be using social distancing in worship, events, and meetings once we are able to be together again. Hand sanitizer stations will be set up and you may still need to wear a mask. If you feel you need to continue to shelter at home, we will still continue to offer online sermons.

As our King, Jesus rules over our spirit and soul and gives us the gift of a new righteousness and eternal life!

But it does not end here. As Christians we share in this eternal kingdom. For we are also prophets, priests, and kings. 
June Scripture Readings


Giving Options

Drive in Worship – A New & Safe Way to Worship



Drive in Worship started on Sunday, May 31 with a Pentecost Celebration and it was a resounding success! **Drive in Worship continues each Sunday at 8:30 am & 10 am in St. Paul's UCC's parking lot** as a safe way to worship that reflects the current social distancing standards for Covid-19.

The worship services will be held Rain or Shine and will last approximately 30-40 minutes. To keep social distancing standards, we ask that everyone plan to stay in their car the entire time. At this time, we cannot accommodate walk-ins – no lawn chairs will be allowed. Our online worship services will still be available for those who are not able to attend the drive-in service.

Since our parking lot is limited, we ask that you RSVP for each car for either the 8:30 am or 10 am worship service

Communion during Covid-19

We'll celebrate our worship service with The Sacrament of Holy Communion on Sunday, June 7 at both Drive in Worship services (8:30 & 10 am). St. Paul's will use Fellowship Cups for communion. Fellowship cups hold all the elements in a disposable, safe cup. You peel off the first label for your wafer and then you peel off the second layer label for your grape juice.

By using the Fellowship Cups, you can be assured that the sacraments served to you will be safe to consume to lower your risk for Covid-19 and yet will feed your soul and your spiritual walk in life while connecting you with the saints, and all others in worship.

In April, 148 households were served for a total of 221 individuals. There were 20 new households.


The Manheim community has been very generous in their support of the pantry, in food donations and monetary donations.

St. Paul's Church Council met on Tuesday, May 12, 2020 @ 7 pm. Below are the highlights of that meeting:

- Pastor Bill opened the prayer/devotion time by reading a letter received from a member expressing their appreciation for keeping us connected in faith. Remember the words of Jesus, let not your hearts be troubled.
- No Endowment or Memorial Fund report.
- Treasurers' Report:
 - Current income is down due to the cancellation of services.
 - New accounts for income and expenses were added to the Operating Account to reflect the \$34,890 Payroll Protection Program loan/grant received in late April.
 - Benevolence – April's mission of the month was Manheim Central Food Pantry.
 - Capital income continues to be good likely thanks to the capital campaign.
- Pastor's Report:
 - Pastor Bill reported that he has been making calls and sending out cards to the

congregation to keep connections going. He is not able to visit those who are ill unless it is end of life.

- He also reported that a crèche has been gifted from St. John's UCC Lebanon (they are closing their doors) which we can use in a procession in Advent.
- We've been getting between 80-100 views for the online sermons. Looking ahead we may want to start a tech team to continue this on a weekly basis.
- Committee Report: Mission trip to Clairvaux Farm (Deep Roots) has been cancelled for 2020 and rescheduled for 2021.

New Business:

- Church Opening Preparations Pastor Bill and Dani presented an idea for a way to hold church - a drive in church service beginning on Sunday, May 31 which is Pentecost





PUZZLE




