

Easter Continues!

The first three weeks of Easter feature vivid encounters with the risen Christ: with Mary Magdalene perceiving Jesus as the gardener; Thomas and the other disciples beholding Jesus' wounds; and the disciples being welcomed to breakfast with Jesus on the lakeshore before His commission to care for his sheep; and Paul along the Damascus road hearing Jesus in the voice of those Paul has persecuted.

Each witness demonstrates some unique insight in seeking and perceiving the risen Christ even as each also experiences some type of elusiveness in Christ's risen presence. This helps us as relate as our encounters with a risen Jesus can be profound and varied, yet also elusive and puzzling.

After the three weeks of encounters with the risen Jesus, the final four weeks of the Easter Season, along with Pentecost, evoke the mystical union of our dwelling in Christ, in the Trinity, and in the beloved community of the church. In these gospel lessons, Jesus prepares his followers for discipleship beyond encounters with his immediate bolidy presence. If the first three weeks of Easter are filled with drama of discovering and encountering the risen Christ, these final weeks of Easter help us learn to dwell in the resurrection as an enduring way of life.

The full Easter season in year C is a rare treasure trove of readings from the book of Revelation. While some of the texts make additional isolated appearances elsewhere in the lectionary, this year's season of Easter includes a text from Revelation every week, and indeed, every text from Revelation that appears in the Revised Common Lectionary is read during this season. This is an opportunity to engage Revelation with sustained attention focusing on hope and renewal, which connect perfectly with the images of Easter, Passover, Baptism and Spring. Ascension Day

Ascension Day is the day that the resurrected Jesus returns to God our Father as told in Acts 1:6-11. In 2025, Ascension Day is on Thursday, May 29.

During his earthly ministry, Jesus could be physically present in only one place at any given time. "Only those could speak to him who came to where he was," explained Archbishop William Temple. "If he was in Galilee, people could not find him in Jerusalem; if he was in Jerusalem, they could not find him in Galilee" (from Readings in St. John's Gospel).

Spiritually speaking, Christ's Ascension means he is with us wherever we find ourselves. Christ desires to be present with us everywhere we go. His presence is universal. He is here now. "Believed in throughout the world, taken up in glory" (1 Timothy 3:16, NRSV) — that is what the Ascension affirms.

Holy Communion


The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated every Sunday in May for the Easter Season.

Of course, there will be a bit of business happening, but there will also be lots of fun, good food with friends! All women are invited to attend!










Pentecost & The Church Picnic

Food Pantry Update

In March, 163 total households or 472 total individuals were served at the Manheim Central Food Pantry. There were 10 new households or 19 individuals in March. Current needs include: pasta sides, egg noodles, canned beef stew, canned pineapple, cream of mushroom soup, crackers, cereal, rice sides and shampoo.

Also needed are newborn diapers size 1, 5 & 6 and adult pullups without tabs in sizes medium and large.

About the FREE Community Breakfast

At their March meeting, Church Council made the tough decision that if a leader for the breakfast does not come forward, that the April breakfast will be the last breakfast before being put on hold, likely until the Fall. We have received some feedback and there are several interested people who have come forward to keep the breakfast going.



Council Highlights

Church Council met on Tuesday, April 15, 2025. Below are highlights of that meeting. Please note that these highlights are shared before the minutes are approved by council at their next meeting, when corrections to details may occur.

Treasurer's Report:

Benevolence: \$1,951 was received for Heifer Project, and \$65 for One Great Hour of Sharing, both March Missions of the Month (MOM). OCWM giving was \$500 in March.

Operating: \$12,381 was received in March for current operating expenses.

Capital: \$2,524 was received for the capital fund with expenditures of \$5,295.79 for the Sanctuary lighting upgrade in March.

New Voices Update:

 New Voices met with council to give an update on their visioning for the future. A list of initiatives has been developed and next steps will include prioritizing the initiatives based on need, impact, and future discernment.

Pastor's Report:

 An upcoming Baptism will be held in the near future.

Committee Reports:

New Voices: see written report.

Property Board: Concrete work will begin in June in the both the front and back of the church. A new coffee pot was purchased. A plumber will be sought re: a clog in the church's down spout; and suggested renovations to the Fellowship Hall were discussed.

Old Business: An update was given on the potential sale of the 32-34 N. Main Street property.







We were blessed to have our Worship Team as a part of your service. I trust that God was glorified and that many were encouraged as we worshipped with you.


We were also blessed to be able to share refreshments with you. Thanks for the hospitality. We enjoyed the interaction and friendliness of your congregation.
