Celebrating 250 Years

It seems like only yesterday when I wrote of the start of those lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer as the lead article for the newsletter. As I now sit at my computer composing this article, it's cold outside and a blanket of snow covers some the outdoor landscape. The lawn mower has been put away, and the snow blower is ready to be pressed into service.

Time does have a way of passing quickly!

As our congregation celebrates two hundred fifty years of Christian worship and fellowship, I don't hear anyone saying that it seems like only yesterday when we were gathering together for worship back in 1769 in that log building. However, had anyone lived that long, perhaps that's what we would be hearing!

I suppose that the parts of St. Paul's history we can recall within our individual lifetimes might seem like they really did occur only yesterday. I

know there are those among us who were here in 1944 for our 175th or 1969 when we celebrated 200 years or our 225th in 1994.

The church directory from our bicentennial year in 1969 contains much historical information, some of which follows.

- A log church was built in 1769.
- Many of you were here when Norman Bucher served as our pastor, but did you know that our first regular pastor in 1772 was also named Bucher?
- During the Revolutionary War our church served as a military hospital following the Battle of Brandywine in 1777.
- Our first bell was hung in the church tower in 1785.
- The interior of the log church was plastered in 1832.
- In 1839 the first Sunday School in Manheim was organized as a union of the Reformed and

- Lutheran churches.
- 1852 marked the opening of the brick building that houses our current Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. This ended 83 years of worship in the log church.
- Wednesday night prayer services were begun in 1870.
- Our first church organ was purchased in 1865 for \$190.00.
- Services in German were discontinued by 1885.
- In 1886 the main church building was expanded to its current size and included the chancel.
- During the year of the 50th anniversary of the brick building in 1902, our membership stood at 175.
- 1903 was the start of Albert Bartholomew's ministry at St. Paul's (not to be confused with Alfred Bartholomew, who served as our interim pastor following Jim Bright's retirement).
- A pipe organ was installed in 1906.
- Rev. Harvey M. Leidy began his ministry as our pastor in 1927. He remained in that position until his retirement in 1951.
- In 1930 a two-story addition that houses the present-day Youth Room and Library was constructed.
- In 1934 we became St. Paul's Evangelical and Reformed Church.
- Howard Paine became our new minister in 1951.
- 1957 marked the year we became St. Paul's United Church

of Christ. It was also the year in which our new two-story Christian Education building was dedicated.

- Norman Bucher began his ministry at St. Paul's in 1960.
- We dedicated a new two-manual organ in 1963.
- A rededication service on January 5, 1969, ushered in our 200th anniversary year.

As stated, these were just a sampling of events representing the first 200 years of our existence. (At what point, if any, were you able to say to yourself, "I remember that"?)

The Anniversary Committee is planning a year of events to commemorate and celebrate our rich history of service to our Lord here in Manheim! As 2019 unfolds, we will have opportunity to reminisce through the fifty years since that bicentennial year. Watch for announcements.

Although Christianity has survived for 2000 years, individual congregations have come and gone. Will there be 275th and 300th anniversary commemorations for St. Paul's?

That will be up to us and those who will follow.

To preserve the legacy of those who preceded us in the faith at St. Paul's, we will all need to be involved in assuring our future.

Will you be up to the task??

Council Highlights

Church Council met on Tuesday, December 18, 2019 and again on Tuesday, January 15, 2019 @ 7 pm. Highlights of both meetings include:

Memorial Gifts & Endowment:

Eric Myers reported:

- ◆ Endowment Fund value is \$937,120.75
- ◆ \$69,999.96 of the \$150,108 approved was withdrawn in 2018
- ◆ \$1,240 of the endowment draw was transferred to St. Paul's Benevolence Fund to cover the percent of the endowment fund that is restricted for "mission support"
- ◆ Memorial Fund assets equal \$14,157.19.

Treasurers Report:

Eric Myers reported:

- ◆ Benevolence: All funds received in 2018 were passed onto the various missions supported in 2018 with the exception of Missions and Community Breakfast.
- ◆ Operating: An additional draw of the endowment fund was made in December to meet operating expenses.
- ◆ Capital: \$17,675.98 in capital income was received in 2018 - well above the \$12,000 budgeted.

Pastor's Report:

- ◆ The Celebrate insert seems to be working well – many are taking them home
- ◆ The 250th Anniversary banner was dedicated.
- ◆ New altar cloths (white and green) are set to be dedicated in January.
- ◆ Pleasant View Communion dates have been set for 2019. They are: Feb. 7, April 11, June 6, Aug. 8, Oct. 10 & Dec. 5.

Committee Reports:

- ◆ Property Board: Thanks to the Board for installing the 250th Anniversary Banner. The generator was tested in mid-January and is in good working order. The new air conditioning units will likely be installed by the end of the month.
- ◆ Search Team: An update will be given once a month in worship. Please keep this committee and this process in prayer.

Old Business:

- ◆ New Paraments: will be dedicated in January. Many thanks to the anonymous donor.
- ◆ Council Nominations: Rick Conley, Joan Hess and Dave Palfrey are all candidates for a 3 year term to end 3/2022. There are still 2 openings with terms ending 2021 available. Council reorganization meeting will take place on Tuesday, February 19 and new members will be installed on Sunday, February 24.
- ◆ Praise Team Leader Job Description: Council approved the praise team leader job description at their January meeting. The position will be posted in house.

New Business:

- ◆ A motion was also made and carried to appoint Steve Smith as Interim Praise Team Leader until the position is filled.
- ◆ Council approved a request from Akira Owens re: a spring or Easter bazaar to be held in early April.

Open Discussion:

- ◆ Winter Cancellation Procedure will be shared with the congregation in upcoming bulletins and newsletters – see Inclement Weather on page 3.

The next council meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 19 @ 7 pm. The February Communion & Church Closer is Ron Forry.






A Godstory from Bible2School


