

Hearing from God Part 2

Last month, I shared with you what I had heard from God to Clean Out, Update – You'll Grow! This month, I'd like to share with you what another member of our New Voices Vision Team heard from God about another endeavor we are discerning as a team.

Dani: "It was strange. Last fall, we talked in New Voices about seeking God's discernment of what our next direction would be. And our team had been focusing on praying and even asking everyone in the church to pray asking God what our next direction should be. And by March — nothing concrete, just what felt like silence. We talked about how it felt like it just wasn't there and we agreed to recommit to continue praying.

It happened when we were in the BLESS Lenten series, while reading about the chapter on Eat, that I began to hear it. In the book by Dave & Jon Ferguson, there's a section under Eat that talked about this thing called Dinner Church which all of a sudden, I just had to check it out. I called another member of our team to share my excitement — am I crazy, could this work, is it a real possibility? Seriously!!!! And when I talked with that other team member, they took it even further — checking it out online and together we found that a nearby church is actually doing this very thing.

Dinner Church is a lot like our FREE Community Breakfast and yet there are some very real differences. The meal can be either a breakfast, lunch, or dinner and can be held weekly or monthly. (This would be determined at a later date.) But the main difference for this meal, is that it is specifically for our neighbors who don't know God/Jesus yet to offer food, a chance to connect and offer care, and get to know our neighbors so that we can model what it means to be followers of Jesus, and build relationships with our neighbors. It isn't about getting to know our neighbors so we can invite them to church, it's about making the dinner church the actual worship service in the same way that Jesus invited people into His ministry.

Hearing from God Continued

After a day or so, I began to have doubts – how can we pull this off with scant volunteers? How can we afford to do this? Will it really make a difference – will it grow the church? All these doubts started to make me rethink the whole idea. But then God intervened in such a profound way and yet I was clueless at first.

It was the third Lenten meal when we talked about Eat and right near the end of Pastor Bill's sermon, I noticed that someone in the group kept looking towards the library – she eventually got up and when she came back, there was a man and a little girl with her. She sat them down, gave them something to eat and somethings to entertain the little girl. After the sermon, many people sat down with this man and his daughter to get to know them and invite them to worship. I have to admit, sadly, that it didn't even dawn on me until the next day, how God was affirming the idea of having a Dinner Church! But the next morning, God basically "downloaded" all these positive thoughts and images of what this man needed, and how we could really get to know our neighbors and give God's support, love and care through a simple meal. He had literally shown me how Dinner Church could work in that one simple evening service and I almost totally missed it!

So at our next New Voices meeting, I shared what I had heard from God. How I/we don't know all the details yet, but it is clearly what God is calling us to do and we now are beginning to flesh out next steps in moving this toward a reality.

Pam: There is no doubt that God has truly blessed St. Paul's with many resources, people, and a beautiful facility. We are placed perfectly to do His Will to reach others right here in Manheim to know, love and serve Him. Please continue to keep this whole discernment process in your prayers – we are proof that not only is God clearly working to fulfill His purpose here at St. Paul's, but also that He hears our prayers and answers them – in His time of course!

Operating: \$10,106 was received in June for current operating expenses.

Capital: \$1,309 was received for the capital fund in June.




Requests for Prayer




