


# Hearing from God Part 3

"For I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope" (Jeremiah 29:11)

Clean out, Update - You'll Grow. What does that mean to you? Update can mean renovate. Our church is a beautiful old building. To keep our church looking beautiful we must maintain and at times renovate our church. The word renovation has many synonyms, including restoration, revamping, makeover, reconditioning, overhauling, and repair. When a building is "under renovation," things can get pretty messy. But it only lasts a while, and then everything turns back to "normal."

Life often feels like a constant state of renovation, whether it's changing our bodies, relationships, or even our home environments. Sometimes, these renovations are welcome and expected, while other times they are unexpected and disruptive. But to not change, means to be stagnant, complacent, lukewarm. In Revelation 3:16, 19-22, John, while in the Spirit, shares this warning from Jesus to the seven churches, specifically the church of Laodicea: "So, because you are lukewarm and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth." I reprove and discipline those whom I love. Be earnest, therefore, and repent. Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in and eat with you, and you with me. To the one who conquers I will give a place with me on my throne, just as I myself conquered and sat down with my Father on his throne. Let anyone who has an ear listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches." Reading these words makes me realize how necessary it is for us to change, to update, to renovate, to conquer our fears about staying safe in the here and now and trust how God is working in our church for a new day, a new generation.

# Hearing from God Part 3 Continued


The word "renovation" itself comes from the Greek word for "renewed" or "re-created". This is what Paul refers to when he speaks of the "new self" we put on in Christ. God desires to renovate us from the inside out, not by changing the external circumstances alone, but by renewing our minds and hearts to be more like Him.

When you face a difficult "renovation" in your life, whether it feels like a messy construction site or a painful tearing down, remember that God is the Master Builder. He is patiently working to create something beautiful and new in you, even when you don't see the finished product.

Trust that His faithful plans are long-conceived, and that even in the midst of disruption, you are being transformed into His image.

Dear Lord, thank you for Your promise to renew us. When life's renovations feel overwhelming, please give us patience and humility. Help us to trust Your faithful work in our lives, knowing that You are creating a new self within us. Amen.












# All Saints' Sunday

# Council Highlights

Church Council met on Tuesday, September 16, 2025. Below are highlights of that meeting. Please note that these highlights are shared before the minutes are approved by council at their next meeting, when corrections to details may occur.

**Endowment Fund:** \$6,000 was received in total income from the rental properties in July and August.

#### Treasurer's Report:

Benevolence: \$861 was received for Teen Central, the August Missions of the Month (MOM). OCWM giving was \$290 in August.

Operating: \$7,872 was received in July and \$10,816 in August for current operating expenses.

Capital: \$974 was received in July and \$1,249 in August for the capital fund.

In comparison we are \$3,100 under last year's giving so far this year.

#### Pastor's Report:

- 14 people turned out to help out on the workday prior to the outdoor worship service – thank you! Two new members were received at that service.
- Pastor Bill will hold confirmation classes for a new member with the plan for this youth to join the church next Easter or Palm Sunday.

#### **Committee Reports:**

- New Voices: see written report.
- Property Board: Ron Forry reported that the permit to repave the sidewalks was granted but the permit to do the concrete and railing work at the back of the church was denied. Steps are being taken to get the permit passed and to complete the project. Estimates were also received for new flooring and ceiling tiles in Fellowship Hall and the large Sunday School room.

Old Business: JD Young updated council on the sale of the church rental property @ 32-34 N. Main St. An agreement has been signed with Homes for Manheim, a local non-profit organization to purchase the property at a price of \$450,000. A \$50,000 down payment was made, which will go into the church's escrow account.

New Business: A budget committee has been formed – Gretchen Miller, Karen Brandt & Pam Herman. The congregational budget meeting will be held on Sunday, December 14 following worship.

Next meeting date is Tuesday, October 21 @ 6 pm.



# Kid's Page




Create a simple and meaningful prayer box your family can use to share requests and pray together all week long.


