## Home on Ferdinand Update

A quick update on the Home on Ferdinand, the transitional housing that is in process for single moms and their kids at the old Danner home.

The building renovations and furniture are nearly complete, with only a few projects yet to be completed.

The Manheim Community Life Group is in the process of hiring several staff positions, on top of having several people already in place, including a social work intern from Lancaster Bible College, all of which are necessary to be able to open the home to the moms. ## Treasurer's Report:

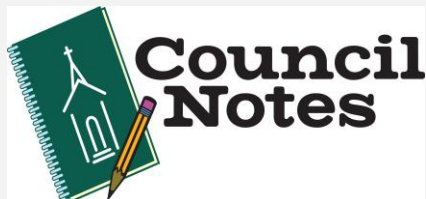
Benevolence: \$906 was received for the Mission of the Month which was Strengthen the Church

Operating: current income below budgeted amount by approximately \$1,700 – this is not unusual for June

Capital: income low for June, but is \$5,200 ahead of giving compared to last year.

## Christian Symbol



### Chi Ro

“Chi” and “rho” are the first two letters in the Greek spelling for Christ (ΧΡΙΣΤΟΣ, pronounced “Christos”). The blending of these two letters into one symbol formed a “sacred monogram.” Early Christians created many such symbols as codes to indicate their discipleship while avoiding detection by Roman persecutors. Many variations of the Chi Rho symbol exist, incorporating a cross, a shepherd’s crook, the Greek letters alpha and omega, an anchor and other images.

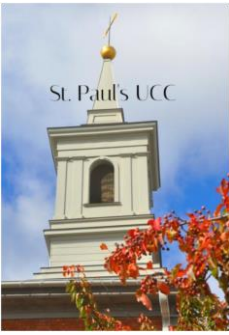
