Our Source of Light

January 6 marks the day of Epiphany, when the wise men (who were Gentiles) came to worship Jesus and bring him gifts. During the church-year season of Epiphany, we remember that God's Son is the Light of the whole world.

Ponder the gifts of Epiphany with these two reflections, written centuries apart:

Your light, dear God, surpasses all other light, because all light comes from you. Your fire surpasses all fire, because your fire alone burns without destroying. The flames of your fire reach into the soul, consuming the sin and selfishness that lie there. But far from damaging the soul, your fire sets it ablaze with love. What moved you to enlighten me with your truth? The fire of your love was the reason. You loved me so much that you could not bear to see me confused and perplexed. Can I ever repay the burning love which you have given me? No, because I have nothing of my own to give. Yet you assure me that the love which you put into my soul is repayment enough. You desire only the joy of seeing me receiving your gift. What more perfect Father could there be!

Epiphany then sends us out into a dark and weary world as women and men with shining faces, until we say with the apostle Paul, "It is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ" [see 2 Corinthians 4:6].



Council Highlights

Church Council met on Tuesday, November 18, 2025. Below are highlights of that meeting. Please note that these highlights are shared before the minutes are approved by council at their next meeting, when corrections to details may occur.

Endowment Fund is up \$55,000 in value for the year to date.

Treasurer's Report:

Benevolence: \$1,546 was received for the October Mission of the Month, which was Church World Services Blanket Appeal. OCWM giving was \$720 in October.

Operating: \$8,334 was received in October for current operating expenses.

Capital: \$1,195 was received in October for the capital fund.

Pastor's Report:

 A Pork & Sauerkraut Dinner will be served on Sunday, January 4 following the 11 am worship service. See more on page 3 of this newsletter for more info. Meals will also be distributed to some of St. Paul's homebound members as well.

Committee Reports:

- Property Board

The front sidewalk project has been

completed; the concrete work at the back of the church for the handicap accessible ramp will not completed now until Spring 2026. The elevator has been repaired and received a good inspection report. An upstairs window blew in during a recent wind storm, but has now been repaired. Further inspection showed other windows need some maintenance and that is occurring.

Old Business:

 Signers fo the rental property settlement were appointed.

New Business:

- First Thursdays have been canceled by the Manheim Chamber of Commerce.
- A new process for distributing funds to Vanguard (Endowment Fund) was adopted.
- New checking accounts are being considered to save money on fees.
- Council received and accepted a letter of resignation from John Degler, Choir Director. He will be honored on Dec. 7. Council is prayerfully considering next steps for music ministry.
- The 2026 proposed budget was approved by Council to go to the congregation for approval on Sunday, December 14.

Next meeting date is Tuesday, December 16, 2025 @ 6 pm.

Poinsettia: The poinsettia (named for Joel Poinsett, the U.S. ambassador to Mexico who first brought the plant to America) is known in Mexico as la flor de la Nochebuena (flower of the Holy Night).

The poinsettia is also an ideal Christmas symbol because its leaves turn red when deprived of sunlight and its flowers (the red inner buds) bloom in December.


