THE NATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS MEMORIAL

The Memorial features two curving, 304-foot-long blue-gray limestone walls. Carved on these walls are the names of more than 22,000 officers who died in the line of duty throughout U.S. history, dating back to the first known death in 1786. Unlike many other memorials in Washington, DC, the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial is ever-changing: new names of fallen officers are added to it each spring, in conjunction with National Police Week.

Bordering the Memorial landscaped park are the two tree-lined "pathways of remembrance" where the names of the fallen officers are engraved.

A powerful statuary grouping of an adult lion protecting its cubs adorns each of the pathway entrances to the memorial. Sculpted by Raymond Kaskey, the bronze statues symbolize the protective role of law enforcement officers and convey the strength, courage and valor that are hallmarks of those who serve and protect.


