Fourth Security Force member dies in Iraq

AIRMAN WARE RECEIVES FULL MILITARY HONORS

On the night of July 3d, Dover Air Force Base Delaware hosted the reception of our fourth Security Forces Airman to die in Operation Iraqi Freedom. The Dover AFB Honor Guard and the Army's "Old Guard" rendered honors on behalf of a very grateful nation.

Airman 1st Class Carl Jerome Ware Jr., 22, of Glassboro, N.J., died due to a "noncombat related incident" at Camp Bucca, Iraq, while assigned with the 886th Expeditionary Security Forces Squadron, according to the Department of Defense officials.

Airman Ware was assigned to the 15 Security Forces Squadron, Hickam Air Force Base Hawaii.

Funeral services for A1C Carl J. Ware were held on Friday, 7 Jul 06 at 1200 at Mathis Funeral Home, 43 North Delsea Dr, Glassboro, NJ., Tel 856-881-6766. Burial followed at Manahath Cemetery, 730 North Main St., Glassboro, NJ. Tel 856-589-2222. Maj Gen Scott Gray, Commander of the Air Mobility Warfare Center Fort Dix New Jersey attended the funeral service and burial. Maj Gen Gray is the former commander of the 89th Wing, Andrews Air Force Base Maryland. General Gray officiated at Proud Warrior - SRA Brian Kolfage's retirement.

Born in Pennsylvania, Carl graduated from Smyrna High School in 2002 and enlisted in the U.S. Air Force in February 2004 as a member of the Security Forces.

Carl loved the military, playing golf, volunteering at base functions and especially was a loving husband and father.

Carl is survived by his wife, Christine; his daughter, Caitlyn Melissa; his parents, David and Barbara Stutzbach of Glassboro; two brothers, David Stutzbach of Dover, Del. and Ryan Stutzbach of Glassboro; and his sister, Angela Ware of Calif.

Airman Gray joins Airman First Class Elizabeth Jacobson, TSgt Jason Norton and SSgt Brian McElroy as the fourth Security Forces Airman to die in Iraq. The three Airman who died earlier perished as a result of battle related injuries following improvised explosive device (IED) attacks.

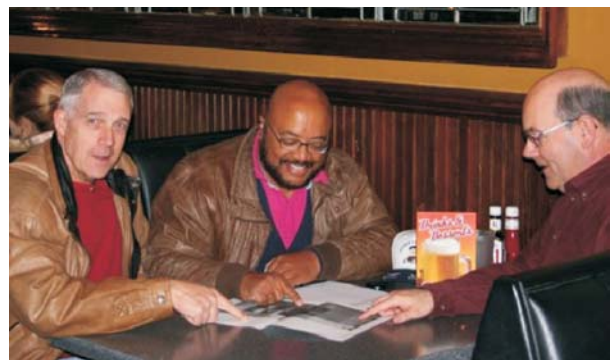

GROUP FUNERAL SERVICES - WASHINGTON PAUSES TO RECOGNIZE SF AIRMEN

Three volleys of seven rifle shots, taps sounding from a distant field, followed by Brigadier General Holmes twice reciting the infamous phrase "On behalf of a grateful nation..." as he presented folded flags to each of the widows - so ended the long journey home for two fallen warriors on a clear June day in Washington.

On Monday, June 5, 2006, the families of TSgt Jason Norton and SSgt Brian McElroy were joined at Arlington National Cemetery by the Deputy Secretary of Defense, Assistant Vice Chief of Staff, US Air Force, formations of Security Force members from the Hq USAF, Hq Air National Guard, 89th Security Forces Squadron with two Military Working Dog teams, a large number of retired Security Forces officers and airmen and several Eagle Chapter members for their burial among the heroes who had gone before them.

TSgt Norton and SSgt McElroy, both members of the 3rd Security Forces Squadron, Elmendorf AFB, Alaska, were killed in action after an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) detonated under their Humvee while on convoy duty near Taji, Iraq on January 22, 2006. Their former commander, Colonel Trapp was also graveside for the funeral and told of how the two warriors lost their lives doing what they enjoyed doing most running convoys.

TSgt Norton, 32, a native of Miami, Oklahoma leaves behind a wife a daughter and son. SSgt McElroy, 28, a native of San Antonio, Texas leaves behind a wife and one daughter. Sergeants Norton and McElroy represent the second and third Security Force members killed in Iraq they were preceded by Senior Airman Elizabeth Jacobson, also a victim of an IED near Camp Bucca, Iraq in late 2005. She is at rest in Pompano Beach, Florida. The two young NCOs are at rest at Arlington Section 60 8539. See pages 10 - 13

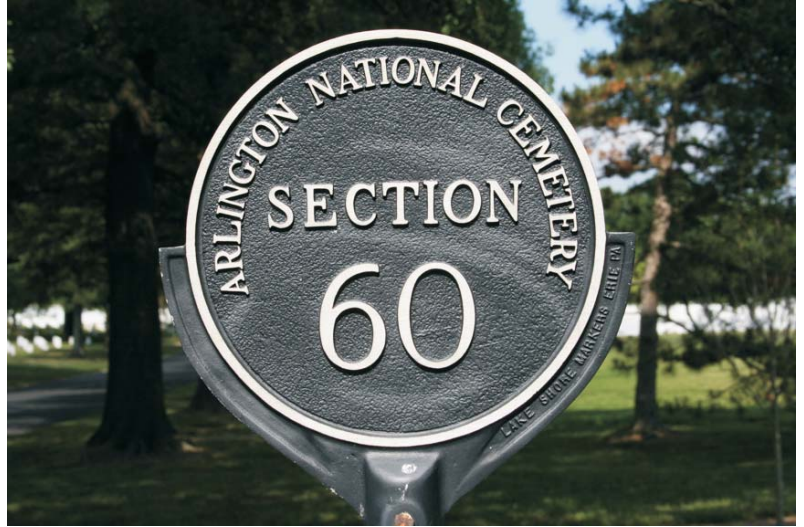

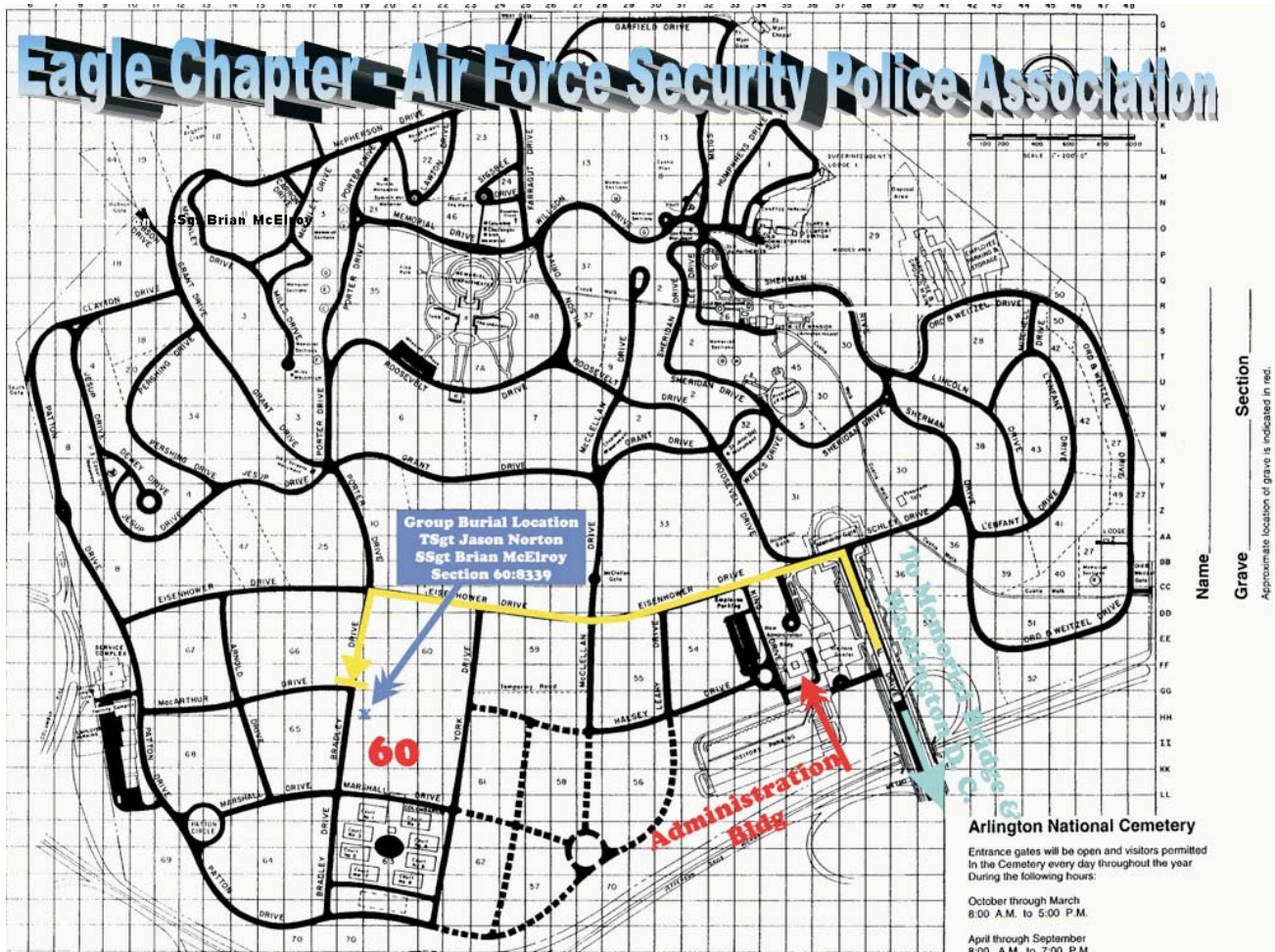

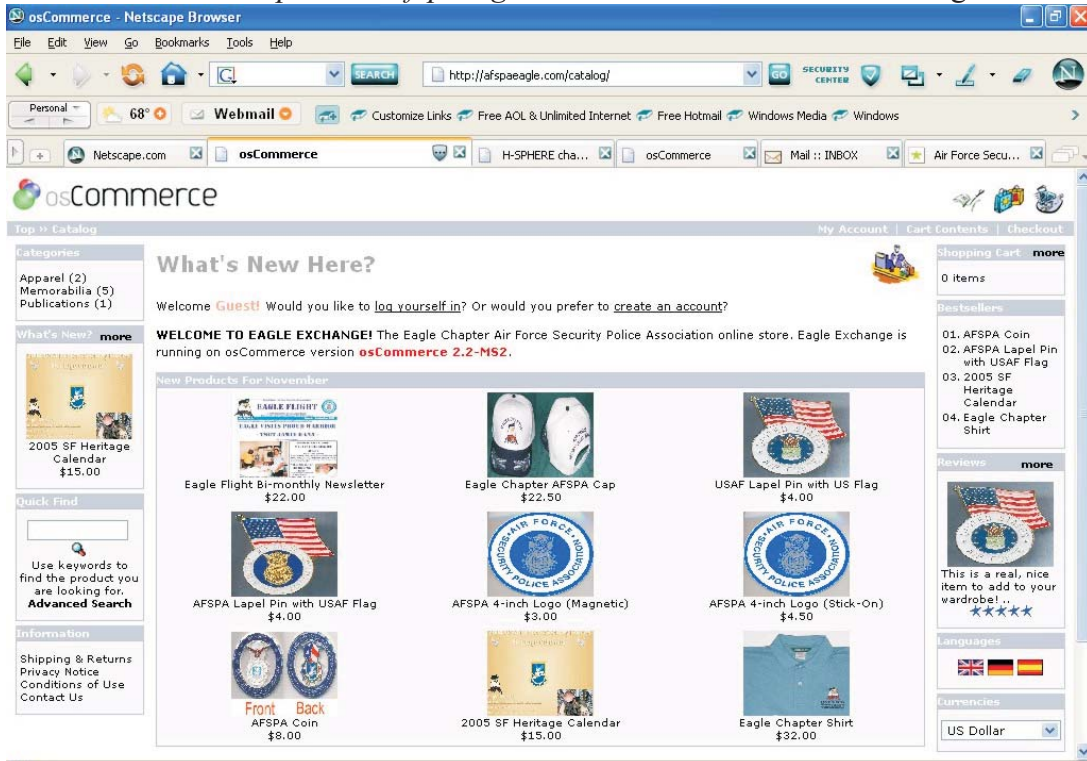
