From Pastor Michelle

History was made on Friday October 20, 2023, as Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson was officially installed as the UCC's 10th General Minister and President. She is our first female president and first woman of African descent and first person who is an immigrant. What an honor it was to be physically present for this amazing Installation Service that was held at Lakewood Congregational Church near Cleveland, OH.

I thought I would share a little bit about our new General Minister and President. This comes from the bulletin that was given out at her service: "Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson answered her call to ordained ministry at Orange Grove Missionary Baptist Church in Durham, NC on August 15, 1999. As a theological scholar at Union Theological Seminary and later at Washington State University she explored multiple faith belongings and the intersecting spaces of God's presence in and among humanity in and outside of the church. In her former roles in the National setting as Associate General Minister, Minister for Racial Justice and Minister for Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations she faithfully served across and with multiple faiths and denominations to bring the unfolding of God's beloved community among us. Today we are charged with installing her as the 10th General Minister and President of the UCC. She is the very first woman to serve in this role, breaking decades long tradition, shattering glass ceilings, forging paths for many other women and girls to follow, all while standing in the strength of the women who have gone before her."

General Secretary of the Jamaica Baptist Union, Rev. Dr. Merlyn Hyde-Riley, was the preacher for the service and she delivered a powerful sermon that was centered around Isaiah 43.16-21 where God exclaims that God is doing a new thing. Certainly, God is doing a new thing and what a new thing it is!!! I truly felt the energy in that service, and I felt the Spirit moving. When it came time for the prayer of Installation all clergy were invited to come forward to do a laying on of hands. I went forward and joined with the 50 plus clergy and we gathered around Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson. This was, hands down(no pun intended), the most powerful moment of the whole service for me.

As I was surrounded by other clergy, I could feel God's Spirit moving through us as we enveloped Rev. Thompson in our prayers and in our love and support. I was also filled with intense gratitude for this moment. I couldn't help but think about how far I have come. I grew up in a church where women were commanded to be silent. Yet here I was, standing among clergy, offering up prayers for the UCC's first female President! As we take time to give thanks this month, I pause to give thanks for the UCC.

I am not sure where I would be if it weren't for the UCC. The UCC is where I found the God of love and not the God of judgment and wrath. I spent so many years thinking I was broken, and I had to be fixed for God to love me. I spent so many years denying who I truly was and all because I was chasing after God's love. I hold such deep gratitude for Nexus UCC because it was at that church that I finally came to see that I had always been loved and nothing would ever change that. It was at Nexus that I found my call and found my God and found my people.

I am so grateful to be serving as your Pastor and I am so thankful I said yes to the call! It's hard to believe it's been a year since I preached my first sermon and then was voted to be your next pastor. What a glorious day that was!!! I look forward to continuing this adventure as your pastor for many years to come!! Please know that I am grateful for each one of you!

- **Partners in Justice** – focus on the missions of the UCC throughout the world as well as participate in other justice-related events and observances



From the Moderator

Did you ever wonder how decisions are made and what HCC does? Here is a basic tutorial of the Harmony Creek UCC Council.

HCC Council consists of the Moderator, Moderator-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer, and seven Ministries. Buildings and Grounds is the eighth Ministry but is not needed as HCC is currently renting our space from Good Shepherd Lutheran. The other seven Ministries are: Church Life,(Carrie Booker), Education,(Lisa Gagle), Finance and Stewardship,(John Allen), Human Resources, (Denise Bowell), Member Care,(Sue Oblinger), Worship Arts,(Elva Blatt), Social & Environmental Justice,(Kathy Swensen & Laurel Kerr). Moderator is Laura Boyd, Moderator-Elect is Elva Blatt, Secretary is Jeri Neihard, and Treasurer is Phil Jenkins. Please note that the Ministry, Justice & Outreach, is now Social & Environmental Justice. Kathy, Laurel, and Council believe the new name better fits the work of that Ministry. The HCC pastor attends council and is involved in discussions but is not a voting member.

Any new head of a ministry, Moderator, and Moderator-Elect are voted on during a December Congregational meeting as well as the 2024 budget and any other items that need a Congregational vote. HCC Covenant members may vote and are encouraged to attend. The congregation will be given official notice a month before any Congregational Meeting. This year's meeting is Sunday, December 10 immediately following church service and Salon. Congregational meetings can be called anytime there are issues that need Covenant members' vote.

The Moderator serves one year following a one year term as Moderator-Elect. After the 2-year committee and service, the Moderator cannot serve either of those positions for 2 years. There are no term limits for any of the other Ministries. We encourage all HCC attendees to become involved in any of the ministries to learn and add ideas. However, only HCC Covenant members may be a Ministry chair and serve on Council.

Please consider joining a Ministry team and joining Council as a Chair of a Ministry. Council meetings are the 2nd Monday each month and usually meet via Zoom. Council and Staff meet together quarterly. We all work together, with the lead pastor and staff, to keep Harmony Creek growing and spreading our message that All are Beloved.

Voter Suppression Team

VOTER EMPOWERMENT MINISTRY TEAM
BECOME PART OF HARMONY CREEK'S NEW JUSTICE MINISTRY!

"Love is the fiery heart beating at the center of the urgent call for justice in our world. Love is the energizing force of justice that insists on fairness and equity for all . . . Without love there can be no justice."

How to Fight Racism: Courageous Christianity and the Journey Toward Racial Justice by Jemar Tisby

In March 2021, Harmony Creek's Voter Suppression Work Group was formed, triggered by outrage over reports about Georgia State Representative Park Cannon's arrest and removal from the state capital for protesting as Governor Brian Kemp signed a sweeping voter suppression bill into law. Our Voter Suppression Work Group was intended to be a short-term justice ministry that would no longer be needed when federal voting rights legislation became the law of the land.

Sadly, we are still waiting for that important legislation and the struggle against voter suppression continues here in Ohio, as well as in Georgia and other states. Our group's "call" has recently grown from concern solely about voter suppression to championing voter empowerment. **No longer a short-term ministry, the Voter Suppression Work Group is now officially the Voter Empowerment Ministry Team, a full-fledged Harmony Creek Social and Environmental Justice Ministry!**

The importance of this new ministry is explained by Carol Costa, who became part of Harmony Creek this summer. Much of Harmony Creek's justice work, including racial equality, LGBTQ rights, economic justice, and environmental preservation, as well as voter suppression, are concerns of democracy. Carol shares, "Actions within the context of democracy are, in fact, social justice actions. Democracy is social justice in action."

Recent and ongoing legislative threats to human rights and environmental justice highlight the need for voter empowerment. Many voters do not realize the need to:

- Understand that their vote really does matter and, in fact, is the only way to change the status quo in a democracy;
- Vote for individuals who reflect their beliefs, rather than simply voting along party lines; and
- Participate in the effort to end gerrymandering in Ohio by working for passage of the proposed amendment to Ohio's Constitution in November 2024 which will establish fair districts.

It is now the task of our new ministry team to find ways to address these goals through education and action. It will take a team effort as we work together in faith to overcome the barriers of tradition, apathy, and hostility fueled by misinformation. Be part of this effort by joining us!
