**BIDDING PRAYER**

P Heavenly Father, we are torn by so many conflicting thoughts and feelings on this holy night. We grieve our Savior’s suffering and death, and feel burning shame in the knowledge that our sin made his death necessary. We repent, Father, of our sin. Ease our grief and remove our shame. Christ who heals all brokenness,
