The months that are yet to unfold will do so as God intends, not us. That is the way it should be. Advent is not our church - it is God's church, the body of Christ. As such God will not abandon the ministry, we have been called to be part of.

Therefore, let it be. Enjoy each other. Be faithful in daily witness. Live in partnership with one another and God. Look forward to what is prepared by the Holy Spirit for Advent. Just be, just be the body of Christ in the world. Open to whatever God has coming next. Live in the fulness of your faith. Know that it is not ours to control, shape, or define and be at peace with this. You see it is not an act of our will, our control, doing the right thing, making the right choice or manipulating the situation. Oh, I know that it's scary giving up our desire for control but no matter what we have told ourselves, in the end we cannot forgive ourselves for our sin of the past or shape the final destiny of tomorrows. God saw to it and continues to make it abundantly clear that we were created to live in the moment, serve God and love one another.

2025 and 2026 will bring interesting days for Advent, for each of us personally and for Kim and I as we live together in God's community. For we are blessed by God's love, filled with faithful zeal and in discipleship with Jesus.

Highlights of Past Year's Activities and Actions:**Education****SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT 2024-2025**

- Erin Welch, Stacy Bolzenius, Laura Bunch and Marcy Layne – teachers
- PreK- 2nd grade:
 - Used "Sparks" curriculum for Pre-K through 5th grade. Laura Bunch and Stacy Bolzenius taught the preK-3 grade. The lessons were well received and focused on Bible stories with a variety of activities.
 - There were between two to three children each week all in the same class. This grouping seemed to work well.
- 3rd-5th grade:
 - The Youth met with Erin Welch and Mary Layne and focused on different lessons from the Bible. They averaged three - five students each week with a total of 6 students participating at this grade level.
 - Confirmation class met at 12:30 p.m. on Sundays. Class was led by Pastor Aaron Layne, Amy Lytle, and Marcy Layne. Discipleship was the focus for this year's confirmation group. There are 8 confirmation students, and friends that attended events as well.

Fellowship

- Ran several 1st Sunday Fellowships with a theme, which were well received again this year. These were generally well attended, providing a great time for conversing.
- Two different Euchre groups continued to meet monthly throughout the year. Reach out to Bob Swinehart if you're interested in joining either group.
- As part of the Souper Bowl of Caring (and Pastor Aaron Layne's last day), we held a great chili cookoff. It came with a resounding positive reception. The idea of making it an annual event tied to the Souper Bowl of Caring was put out there for discussion.
- The Lenten Soup suppers, followed by worship, were a success. The worship services were held in the sanctuary, rather than the Fellowship Hall, this year, as they were more of a traditional service led by Pastor Hinkelman.
- The Annual Easter Egg Hunt was well organized and led by Marcy Layne, Sarah Eiselstein, and Alysha Clous. This event was well attended.

Y2 Youth

- Y2 continued to meet monthly with a variety of activities, including Bible lessons, crafts, and games, led by Marcy Layne.
- A main focus of the year was to establish relationships between the Youth and their Prayer Buddies.
- The final event was the Buddy Banquet in May, where we celebrated and honored our Prayer Buddies.
- Other activities this year included Christmas with the Staff, Hopewood Outdoor Camp Night, leading a Lenten service, and making gifts for their Prayer Buddy Owls.

Goals for next year:

- Continue to build out the Parish Life team to fully support the mission of fellowship, growing in faith, and welcoming. We intend to add new teammates to help us support that mission.
- Continue to use the "Sparks" curriculum for the younger children.
- Encourage parents to support the spiritual education of their children by getting them to Sunday School more often.

Team Purpose:

The Social Concerns Ministry Team's purpose is to encourage and support the ministries of social outreach, Christian Care, overall witness, and other ministries as determined.

Social Concerns Ministry Team Leader: Jennifer Parker

Highlights of Past Year's Activities and Actions:
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Thanksgiving Ingathering (Chair: Jennifer Parker)

- This project provides Thanksgiving dinners to needy families in Central Ohio through the LSS Food Pantry. The congregation has generously supported this ministry for a number of years. Members are asked to make cash donations rather than food donations, as LSS has far more buying power than we do (\$1 = \$5.25). In November of 2024, members of the congregation donated \$2,500 to LSS. The cash donation assisted with the purchase of the needed turkeys and other food items.

❑ Blessing of the Animals (Chair: Jennifer Parker)

- On the first Sunday in October of 2024, Advent celebrated its **30th annual** Blessing of the Animals! The theme was “**Coexistence – Make Space, Human Race**” – recognizing that humans are part of a larger web of life, where everything is interconnected. Pet parents/siblings brought their dogs and cats to be blessed by Pastor Layne. The Youth made dog treats for all the doggies in attendance. We had several new attendees who saw the post on Facebook. We even had a drive-up blessing of two beautiful but shy dogs. Those attending the service as well as other members of the congregation donated numerous cans and bags of dog and cat food for the LSS Food Pantry.

❑ God's Work, Our Hands (Chairs: Jennifer Parker and Jean Pontious)

- In conjunction with the ELCA's *God's Work, Our Hands* weekend (the second weekend in September), the Social Concerns Team asked the congregation to donate items to be included in "blessing bags" for the less fortunate -- items such as toothbrushes and toothpaste, deodorant, combs, socks, chap stick, shampoo, hand sanitizer, and soap. The items were packaged by Advent's Youth in gallon-sized zip-lock bags, along with an insert expressing God's love for the recipient and listing telephone numbers and addresses for the many forms of assistance that are available in the community. The bags were made available for members to distribute. This year we were able to assemble 300 blessing bags as a result of members' donations and two \$250 grants from Thrivent.
- The Team also asked for donations of school supplies which were given to a teacher in our congregation for distribution to students in the Columbus City Schools.

❑ **LWR Quilts: Isabel's Quilters (Chair: Norma Pitts)**

- Isabel Quilters make quilts for Lutheran World Relief (LWR). A quilt is a tangible way to express love and offer support to our neighbors in need, as LWR serves in over 100 countries. The United States was added to the countries served this program year. Quilts provide shelter from the elements, warmth as bedding or covering, privacy as a door or divider, and comfort and reassurance that others care. LWR reports that these quilts are highly regarded throughout the world because of the quality and consistency of size (60" x 80").
- Group members include Laura Bunch, Jane Hart, Barb Murphy, Norma Pitts, Emily Shipman, Sylvia Wallace, and Brenda Wheeler. We meet in Brenda's home where supplies can be stored and elevated tables can remain in place for our work. Special thanks to Jim Klinksick who donated materials, built and installed supports to stabilize the two quilting tables.
- Blessing of the Quilts was held on October 6, 2024 in which 54 quilts were displayed on the communion rails and blessed before delivery. On October 12, Brenda Wheeler and Emily Shipman took boxed quilts to an in-gathering at Ohio Gro for shipment to the LWR warehouse for later distribution to other parts of the world where needs are greatest.
- The group met regularly most months, the first and third Tuesday, with some time out for vacations, holidays, illnesses and other needs. Our time together was used to assemble and tie quilts for completion. In between sessions, homework was done to cut fabric squares, design and assemble kits for quilt tops, sew quilt tops and/or sew the bindings to finish quilts.
- A display with a quilt as background was set up in the narthex to promote the ministry and share feedback as to where our quilts were utilized. A map provided by LWR showed countries receiving quilts from the LWR warehouse where our quilts are sent.
- From Jane Vollrath's family donation last year, an unfinished baby quilt was completed by Brenda and Sylvia and gifted to Tony and Makenzie Maggio, our seminary student and his wife, on the birth of their baby.
- Members of the Advent family and friends may participate in this ministry through financial support, providing fabrics for quilt tops, cutting fabric squares, or donating gently used, clean unstained queen or king size sheets or other sheets that measure at least 64"x84". Thanks to all who made contributions this year. In addition, Brenda received 50 quilt tops assembled and donated by the women of St. Paul's Lutheran church (New Rome) for us to complete sometime in the future. Also, this year, a Christmas themed quilt was available for sale, and a generous donation was directed to Isabel's Quilters Ministry.

❑ **Mitten Tree (Chair: Jennifer Parker)**

- A Christmas tree is set up in the Narthex in early December. Members donated dozens of hats, gloves, and scarfs for children. We also received donations from residents of The Forum. This year the items were provided to a teacher in our congregation for distribution to students attending Columbus City Schools.

❑ **SOUP-ER Bowl of Caring (Chair: Pastor Aaron Layne)**

- To raise money for the LSS Food Pantry, our congregation partnered with the wonderful folks of Clinton Heights Lutheran Church. As a result, a total of \$3,163 was donated to the Pantry. We put a tackle on hunger!

❑ **Bed Brigade (Chair: Trevor Downing)**

- The Bed Brigade -- a shared ministry with St. John Lutheran Church in Grove City -- provides beds to families in need while at the same time sharing the love of Jesus Christ. Since its inception, the Bed Brigade has provided over 4500 beds to families in need. This also means 4500 Bibles/Bible storybooks to bed recipients. Today the Bed Brigade builds and delivers roughly 500 beds every year, with Advent delivering roughly 60 of these. Advent has continued to be a regular partner in delivering beds, now on the second Saturday of each month.

❑ **Ongoing Projects**

- The Social Concerns Team continues to sponsor the collection of aluminum pop can tabs to support the Ronald MacDonald House and used eyeglasses for donation.
- Throughout the year, members of the congregation donate items for the LSS Food Pantry and place them in the designated bin in the Narthex. The items are then delivered to the Pantry by volunteers.
- We periodically ask the congregation for items to include in Blessing Bags for the less fortunate, with the hope we will have some bags available throughout the year.

2025-2026 Vision Goals:

- Continue to join with the Worship & Witness Team to more effectively fulfill our mission, as both teams share the common goal of “witnessing.”
- Continue to look for opportunities to serve others beyond our local congregation.
- Recruit more people to be leaders of, or involved in, each of the ministries and to serve on the Team.

Highlights of Past Year’s Activities and Successes:

❑ Worship

- Blessed with Jean Pontious and Marcy Layne’s music leadership including all the choirs and special music throughout the year.
- Jean continued to recruit individuals and groups to provide the Special Music each Sunday.
- Pastor Dave Hinkelman and Jean Pontious continue to hold worship service weekly at The Forum, including Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Attendance averages between 30-35 per week.
- Music Appreciation Reception
- Blessing of the Quilts
- Old Time Gospel Sunday
- First Sunday Fellowship/Refreshments
- The Live Nativity was well attended.
- During Lent, weekly Wednesday evening services were held along with a soup supper. Holy Week offered services each evening. On Maunday Thursday and Good Friday, a noon service was offered as well as the evening service.
- Special thanks to all who serve on the Worship Teams, Altar Guild Teams, and those who provide communion elements and floral contributions, including special flowers/arrangements/adornments to the worship space. We encourage others to join the teams.

☐ Witness

- Several new individuals and families are regularly attending.
- Visitors are always encouraged to sign the Welcome Response Cards and share their contact information, thus allowing a Team member to follow up.

☐ Prayer Chain

- The Prayer Chain continues to be an invaluable witness tool with many members participating and sharing the needs of their family, friends and neighbors.

DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRIES ANNUAL REPORT 2024 – 2025

This was a busy year for the youth at Advent! What's App was used for communications to youth and parents to communicate on a weekly basis.

Sign-ups for meals, and events and permission slips were created digitally and posted on adventelc.org/youth.

When schedules allowed, the youth director attended high school student events to support the youth, such as band, orchestra, theatre, sporting events, etc.

August kicked off with a Back-to-School Bash. We ate lunch together and enjoyed time at Magic Mountain.

In September, we :

- Assembled Blessing Bags for the homeless.
- Decided on a Mission Trip through Youthworks, for summer 2025 and youth learned about it and signed up.
- Kicked off our H.A.B.I.T.S. series beginning the exploration of habits that encourage our relationship with Jesus, our church community, etc.
- Held a game day/potluck at the Layne house.

In October, we:

- Made pet treats and handed them out at the “Blessing of Animals” event at Advent!
- Had a Graeter's social Sunday
- Attended the Fall Festival at Hopewood Pines

In November, we:

- Continued our H.A.B.I.T.'s Bible Study
- Combined youth/confirmation “Brush Crazy” outing, where students used pour painting technique to make their own canvas art to take home. Discussed God's creation and its uniqueness like their art.
- High School donated the meal and attended Jacob's Porch, an OSU Lutheran ministry.

In December, we:

- Had outstanding participation with youth and families in the Live Nativity event. Members participated in music, and the telling of the Birth of Jesus acting and invited friends to be a part of it as well.
- Decorated cookies for Christmas Caroling event
- Confirmation, high school and families delivered decorated cookies and Christmas Caroled to 3 area nursing home/assisted living facilities in Upper Arlington.

In January, we:

- Had Nerf night with confirmation and high school students and friends with food, fun, and how we can be armed with the word of God
- Continued H.A.B.I.T.S. Bible study
- High school brought meal and attended Jacob's Porch worship service

In February, we:

- Had a combined confirmation/high school nature hike with Holy Trinity at Quarry Trails Metropark
- Attended a Farewell reception for Pastor Aaron

- Nick Bates came and gave a special lesson about hunger to the confirmands and the high school had a Starbucks outing to catch up with each other.
- Youth Board met to review the year thus far, and discuss any items or concerns.
- Confirmands and high school chose, created, and planned for the talent show
- Had a combined lesson with both groups on “Do you need to believe in Jesus to go to Heaven?”

In March, we:

- Participated and ran the Pancake Supper and talent show. Well attended, and over \$400 was raised for the youth.
- Held VBS training/kickoff for confirmands, high school and adult volunteers
- Sorted and bagged plastic eggs for Easter Egg Hunt
- Wrapped up H.A.B.I.T.S Bible Study
- Informed and Encouraged youth of all ages to sign up for church camp at Hopewood Pines for summer week 1

In April, we:

- High school brought meal and attended Jacob’s Porch worship service
- (I)began coordinating youth volunteers for late service wine distribution.
- Had approximately 20 youth volunteers and family members set up and participate in the Easter Egg Hunt Event
- Swoop N Service: Swept out/organized garage of Advent member
- Put together final exam packages/signed cards for Advent college students

In May, we:

- Celebrated May 4th, buy doing a Bible study on Good vs. Evil.
- Combined with Holy Trinity’s Youth for an end-of-the-year picnic and kickball game at Fancyburg Park. 20 youth participated
- Youth Board met to review the year and look forward to next year.

Some of the other items/programs:

Time and Change: Continued to support a Compassion International Student.

Promoted, collected, counted, and rolled change.

Prayer Buddy Program: Recruited O.W.L’S (Older Wiser Lutherans) to be a part of this mentoring program and paired them with our elementary aged students. Created questions for each pair to meet and answer together on a monthly basis. Had a kick-off Prayer Buddy event in the fall and an End-Of –The-Year Prayer Buddy Banquet in May.

Puppet Ministry: I chose the Easter skit and puppeteers and they performed at the Easter Egg Hunt

Percussion Christmas Program: I coordinated schedules and volunteers for the percussion retelling of the Birth of Jesus for the Family Christmas Eve services. Practices were held on Sunday mornings in November and December.

Christmas with the Staff: I planned, purchased, and set-up and tore down the events with the preschool-elementary-aged students.

Continuing Education: Attended monthly Youth Clusters in Bexley with other Youth and Family Directors, Attended the Renew Retreat at Hopewood Pines in the fall for Youth Directors, Attended the ELCA Extravaganza Convention in Lexington, KY.

Promote friendships across age groups.

Coordinate events with other youth groups and outings to benefit the faith formation of our youth.
