

Charlotte Berryman has been nominated for the 5th Vice President of Education for the Republican Women of Prescott (RWOP). She has been a life-long Republican, lived in Prescott 3 years, and has been a member of RWOP for almost 2 years. During 2022, she volunteered for the Ways and Means committee and received Volunteer of the Month Award in May.

Charlotte feels strongly that, given the quickly changing political and educational environment, it is incumbent upon us to continue working with Prescott Unified School District (PUSD), legislators, parents, and the state to improve educational opportunities for our children. It is also just as important to provide educational opportunities, which support Republican values, to our members and the Yavapai County community at large.

Charlotte began her 40-year working career as a Registered Nurse, obtained a Bachelor Degree in Nursing and eventually a Master's Degree in Health Administration. She advanced into senior level management positions later in her career.

Given Charlotte's concern regarding the poor performance of Arizona's K-12 public education system, she volunteered in granddaughter's classroom where she saw the need for parental and grandparent involvement in their children's education. She witnessed the variation among the teacher's styles and abilities and understood the importance of parental rights.

After witnessing her granddaughter's movement going from a district school to a charter school, she saw the difference in teaching techniques used in the charter school setting. Her granddaughter was two years ahead of her district school classmates when she returned to that school environment during the pandemic in 2021. This raised her concerns that our schools are veering away from basic education with the Social Emotional Learning (SEL), Teachers Curriculum Institute (TCI) and Critical Race Theory (CRT) curricula.

She continued her involvement and interest in the Prescott Unified School District race supported by RWOP, she attended PUSD School Board meetings, and has a vested interest in the education of all children.

In addition, Charlotte is a Precinct Committeemen and is working on the Voter integrity Subcommittee. She is working with a small group of individuals who are evaluating registered voters between the ages of 90-100 living in Yavapai County to determine whether the voter still lives in Yavapai County, has moved to another location, is deceased, and whether there is any question about their residency status. Any voter with a questionable status is referred on to the sub-committee chairman for further review.
