Take joy in this gift and do all you can,

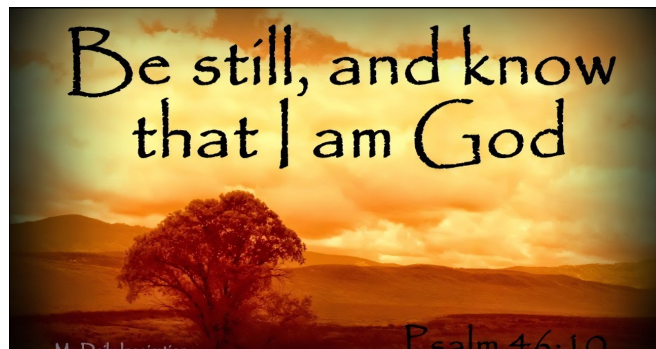

TREASURER'S MESSAGE

As of the end of September 2022, we have received 30.94% or \$95,927.80 of our Pledge to National of \$310,000. Giving is slightly higher than the same time in 2021. As we come into November there are a couple of giving opportunities to highlight. First is the World Thank Offering program highlighting "Life-Giving Creation and Transformation" which is found in the 2022-2023 Program Resource book or available at this link https://www.umwmissionresources.org/downloads/ProgResource2022-23_WorldThankOffering.pdf. The World Thank Offering is where gifts of gratitude are given and is one of the five channels of Mission Giving. The second giving opportunity is the National Day of Giving on Tuesday November 29, which is the Tuesday following Thanksgiving. There will be opportunities to give to United Women in Faith so be on the look out for those links on the website uwfaith.org or our conference Facebook page.

The month of October is Cybersecurity Awareness month. According to the Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), cybersecurity is the art of protecting networks, devices, and data from unlawful access or criminal use, and providing confidentiality, integrity, and availability of information. There is a lot going on in that definition, but here are the basics you should know now as we continue to do business in a digital world.

- Think Before You Click: Recognize and Report Phishing: If a link looks a little off, think before you click. It could be an attempt to get sensitive information or install malware.
- Update Your Software: Don't delay – if you see a software update notification, act promptly. Better yet, turn on automatic updates.
- Use Strong Passwords: Use passwords that are long, unique, and randomly generated. Use password managers to generate and remember different, complex passwords for each of your accounts. A password manager will encrypt passwords securing them for you!
- Enable Multi-Factor Authentication: You need more than a password to protect your online accounts, and enabling MFA makes you significantly less likely to get hacked.

National has provided us a link to the toolkit created by CISA here https://www.cisa.gov/sites/default/files/publications/CAM22_PublicToolkit_FINAL_OCC_CSD_DIR_508c.pdf.

Instructions on how to add "United Women in Faith" to your local unit bank account as a Doing Business As, or DBA, will be giving to the District Treasurers to pass along to the Local Treasurers during the District Officer training meeting on **November 5**. If you have questions or encounter problems at your bank, please let me know.

As a reminder, as the end of the year approaches, please send in your 2022 monies to your District Treasurer before the end of the year so those funds can be sent on to Conference in a timely manner. As you are deciding what monies to send, per the United Methodist Women Handbook 2022-2024, a local group should keep in its treasury only the minimum amount necessary to carry it into the first few months of the next year, until members' Mission Giving pledges and gifts begin coming in. The committee on finance recommends how to use these extra funds. The committee could choose one of the following options: 1. Send the extra funds as additional mission funds (added to your Pledge to Mission). 2. Present one or more Special Mission Recognitions or Gifts to Mission to members or friends of the unit. 3. Make a supplementary gift to "A Brighter Future for Children and Youth," a mission program that receives United Women in Faith National Office funding. Funds given in these ways to "empty the treasury" should be sent to the district treasurer. There are lots of children and youth books on our lists from previous years and 2023. They make terrific lessons, programs, devotions as well as opportunities to read to others of all ages. The new list of reading program books for 2023 has been posted on the national website. They have gone back to putting the books in a printable catalog format with pictures and descriptions of each of the books by categories. Also included in the catalog is all the information about the reading program, its purpose, directions for participating, etc. So I am thankful they have returned to this information.

Indiana readers have a special book to add to our reading list for this year! Be sure to get a copy of the Lucille Raines Residence book **A Road to Hope** by Sarah Spearman! It is \$15 and the funds will go for residents emergency use. Sarah interviews nine LRR residents and it is very good and insightful. We are being very flexible and counting this book towards our reading program in Indiana - either Social Action or Nurturing for Community. Thanks to Sarah for

this project! You will want to get it and perhaps use it for a program.

In 2023 you can read any of the books from the lists approved for previous years of 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023. SO, you have lots of great books to read and enjoy, learn from, and share with others. Start or join a reading group with others interested in the same books - on line. on Facebook, or Zoom. Then let us know about it too! I just finished a good youth book, **One Dress. One Year** by Bethany Winz. It is one girl's stand against human trafficking which is unfortunately still a critical issue. It also addresses a teen girl's self image and faith. (2021-22 Ed for Mission category)

Remember, the **Faith Talks podcasts** are plentiful and interesting and approximately one hour long. Listening to two of these counts as one **Spiritual Growth** book. Listening to three podcasts is equal to a Bonus Book in the Spiritual Growth category, and Bonus Books are equal to two books in that category.

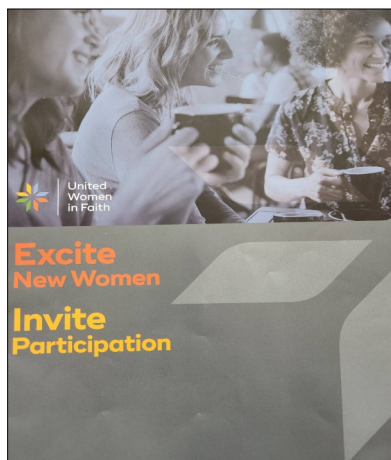

Dear Sisters,

It was wonderful seeing you at our Annual Celebrations. In this time of change for our sisterhood and the church, I would like for you to take clues of how to respond from nature. This has been my practice for many years now during the Fall season. It was not until I was an adult traveling home to North Carolina through the Appalachian mountains that I gained this calming and renewing appreciation for Fall/Autumn. When you grow up as I did the granddaughter of a farmer, fall means a lot of work. Oh yes, it is the gathering of the last crops from the fields. Which is exciting. But it is the also, the canning and freezing of those crops. The planning of the crop rotation so the soil can be tested. Then manure and fertilizer must be applied to the specific areas for the specific crops. Then cover crops must be planted to ensure you do not lose the soil and amenities during the winter months. And until winter has set in and there are no more crops to harvest, there is this constant dance of covering the crops to prevent frost bite and uncovering them to prevent sun burn. So, it was during my first trip from Indiana to North Carolina through those majestic mountains which are the home of our Cherokee, Iroquois, Powhatan and Shawnee sisters that I fully inhaled the magnitude and breath of Ecclesiastes 3:1-8. Sisters, this annual drive through the mountains became my time to be silent and to search the hollows of my mind with God to determine what should remain as his priorities and what should be counted as lost. It was during this time I asked God what I should keep in my daily routine for the coming year and what I should discard. So dear sisters as we walk boldly

together into the next 150 plus years of this creative supportive sisterhood, let us take in the symphony of the fall of the leaves. Reach down in your gut and ask God to guide you to His purpose for you within our sisterhood. Trust the Holy Spirit to guide you through our mission work. There is still work to be done to improve the lives of women, children and youth. Let us not focus so much on the change that is occurring that we not enjoy the blessings of our missional relationships. Your mission gifts are needed to ensure the needs of today are met. Your Legacy gifts ensure that the work of our organization will continue into perpetuity. Our sisterhood is strong because of our foremothers and YOU! 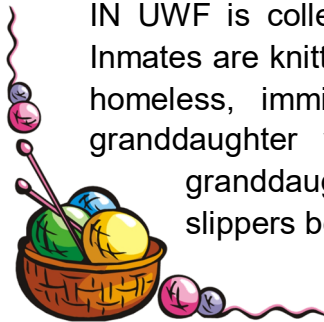

The Raines Residence is in critical need of elevator replacement. The ability to secure parts for the current very obsolete elevator has become difficult/almost impossible, resulting in the elevator frequently being "down" for lengthy periods. Not only that, because of the aged architecture, significant structural changes are needed to accommodate a modern elevator. Our Challenge Goal is \$750,000.

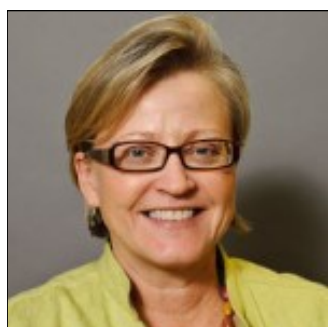

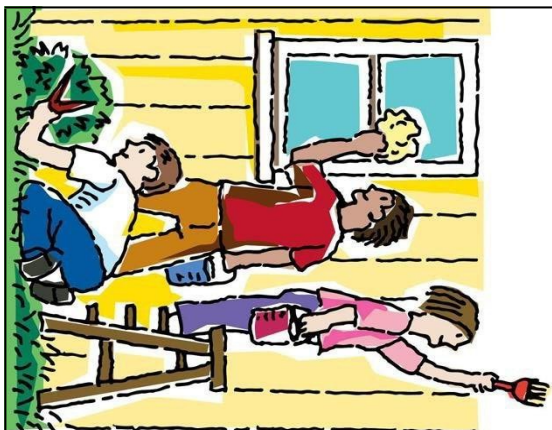
