FROM THE PRESIDENT

Recently my son and I traveled to Boston to visit my granddaughter who attends Northeastern University there. In addition to my excitement to see where Kate lived and attended classes, I was also interested in visiting the church where eight women met in 1869 and organized for mission! The building was a huge edifice surrounded by a fence. Everything was locked so we could not go inside but it was a joy to be in proximity to where our predecessors gathered to learn about the plight of women in India. And also where they decided to do something about those injustices!

Having just returned from the 2022 Assembly of United Women in Faith, I am dedicated to continuing to do the work begun by these women of faith so long ago. We have a mandate from God to reach out in love to help our neighbors. We were challenged by theologian in residence, Janet Wolf, to see the needs around us and to embrace the possibilities that God presents us to make a difference.

I am still reeling from the news of 19 children and 2 teachers in Texas being killed by a gunman. Our mandate is to advocate for women, children, and youth. These are our children and our neighbors no matter how far away they might live. It is up to us to take a stand against all types of violence in our society. That means contacting those in power urging them to put in place laws and regulations that will stop future events of this kind from happening.

Thoughts and prayers are all well and good if they lead us to take action! Thoughts and prayers should be the beginning, not the end, of our concern for humanity as well as nature.

Only the name of our organization has changed. Our purpose is still the same -- to stand up for women, children and youth as we care for their health, environment, racial justice, education, and economic justice. United Women in Faith still offers many tools for our use to make a difference. So let's put on our overalls, strap on our tool belts and get to work for the sake of our world!

INDIANA UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH TURNED IT UP IN ORLANDO!







Registration will end July 1. You can also have a viewing party for Mission u 2022 at your home or church. However, each member of your group must register and pay the \$25 registration fee.




We will end our time together at 5:00, after an uplifting worship service.

We have great news: being in community is God's desire for us all! During Mission u 2022, we will reflect upon the kind of community which Jesus is calling us to be. We now find ourselves in a period of disruption and uncertainty. In the midst of a devastating pandemic, a divisive political climate, racism, ecological crises, economic turmoil, and war, we will turn to the stories of Jesus which have anchored Christian communities for two millennia. Our hope is that you will leave Mission u with a bigger and broader vision of the community Christ is calling us to be in times of loss, grief, disruption, and fear.

What would be possible if we were to tend to the needs of our communities in small yet radical ways, as Jesus did in the stories presented in Luke 13? Who can we be together? Is there hope?

The Bible, specifically Luke 13, will be the main resource for our virtual Mission u 2022. The secondary resource book, "Who Can We Be Together?" is a teacher's manual, which will allow a participant to take the study of Luke 13 back to their local church as a Bible study, a Sunday School class, or present it at a local unit meeting.


Virtual Mission u will be held July 15-17. Registration is only \$25.

We will begin with worship on Friday, July 15 at 6:30 p.m. and end at 9:15. Saturday, July 16, will begin at 10:00 a.m., break for lunch, and end at 4:30 p.m. Sunday we will conclude our time together by meeting from 1:00 p.m. to 5:30, which will allow time for participants to attend their local church that morning if they so desire. Study Leaders will cover eight lessons taken from Luke 13. All times EST.

The Raines Residence is in critical need of elevator replacement. The ability to secure parts for the current very obsolete elevator has become difficult/almost impossible, resulting in the elevator frequently being "down" for lengthy periods. Not only that, because of the aged architecture, significant structural changes are needed to accommodate a modern elevator. Our Challenge Goal is \$750,000.

"Rebuilding Lives- Committed to Addiction Recovery"

Forty-five years ago on May 13, 1977, the Lucille Raines Residence opened its doors to provide support, community and a safe place to live for people recovering from addiction. The United Methodist Women of Indiana were called by God to be pioneers in offering ministry and hope to people wanting to recover from addiction to alcohol and drugs. Many lives have been changed for the better because of this ministry. The problem of addiction is much greater in our world today than it was in 1977 and so is the need for the Lucille Raines Residence.

God's presence and help have always been evident in the ongoing life of Raines. Whatever challenges have occurred have always been met as God's people have responded to the call to provide regular support and help for special needs. As United Women of Faith we continue the outreach of United Methodist Women in supporting the ministry of Raines. The challenges to all of us have increased as a result of the Covid-pandemic and the impact on our economy. As people of faith we know that God is always with us and that God always makes a way through any opportunity or challenge. We also know that God works through us to make that way.

The Lucille Raines Residence is facing a challenge. It is past time to make the residence accessible for those with health and mobility needs. It is also time to replace the elevator for this six-story building that can no longer be repaired because it is outdated. God will make a way for these needs to be met as we work together and invite others to join us in raising \$750,000. God is already on the move to clear the way, but it will take all of us together to accomplish the goal.

Sarah Busch Spearman has produced a book, *A Road to Hope*, which contains stories of lives that have been changed because of Raines. Read it and share it with others to learn how lives can be healed through faith, support, community and safety.

TREASURER REPORT

I am back from attending Assembly in Orlando and had a wonderful time. I enjoyed all the moments of Assembly 2022 had to offer. The singing, music, the keynote addresses, meeting women from other conferences, and hearing more about how we can “Turn It Up!” for United Women in Faith back conference, districts and local units. While at Assembly, I attended the Leadership Development Days (LDD) session for Treasurers and Education and Interpretation. Both roles were combined for this session as each closely connected with Mission Giving in some way.

While in the session, learned more about the research and findings from surveys of women that lead to the rebranding and new opportunities for women to participate with United Women in Faith. Mission Giving and the five channels has not changed however there are additional opportunities for giving. Targeted giving to three specific areas is an option. The areas are Social Action and Justice Work (support quadrennium priorities), Spiritual Growth and Nurturing Opportunities (programs like Soul Care retreats) and Education and Leadership Development (training leaders). These areas can be added on the remittance form in the National, International and UMCOR section by listing them by name. You can also give electronically with Vanco Faith. The conference has a Vanco site here <https://secure.myvanco.com/L-YZ57/home> set up for women to give online or with a mobile app. Here is the link to the site and links to the Apple <https://apps.apple.com/us/app/vanco-mobile-faith-engagement/id1504961674> and Android

https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.vancopayments.vancomobile&hl=en_US&gl=US apps. On the Vanco mobile app, the conference name is under “United Women in Faith of Indiana Conference”.

When you are giving by check, please continue to write “United Methodist Women” with the local unit, district or conference name. We recently received information at the conference level on establishing a Doing Business As (DBA) name using “United Women in Faith” instead of “United Methodist Women”. Once the conference DBA is established, then the districts and local units can officially establish a DBA if desired.

During the LDD session, it was announced that in 2021 the Indiana conference was one of 15 conferences to increase its mission giving compared to 2020. Congratulations to us and thank you to all who contributed to our increase in Mission Giving in 2021! Let us continue along that same path of giving in 2022.

It was our first in-person gathering in over two years and the ladies were thrilled to reconnect! Our leaders, Vickie Newkirk and Kathy White challenged us to open our hearts as they guided us in searching God's Word. The prayer song, "Gentle Shepherd", began each session and was our invitation for God's Spirit to come and lead us. Music is such an important part of worship and we were blessed to have Victoria Dumpert and Martha Riley to lead us. A favorite time was an old fashioned hymn sing both Friday and Saturday.

Since this is an Assembly year, there will not be the Fall Spiritual Growth retreat. I know the sisters in the North who could not attend the March retreat will be disappointed. But I do want to encourage you to attend the Silent Retreat October 21-23 at the St. Joseph's Retreat center just north of Tipton.. Attendance is limited so be watching for the registration this Fall. Last year was my first time to attend, and not knowing what to expect, I did find it a very meaningful spiritual experience. The grounds were beautiful with guided walks, our private rooms were comfortable, the meals delicious, and the chapel for communal worship was awe inspiring. We were given scriptural meditations to work on as desired. Crafts, puzzles, and books were available. But with the silence and the absence of everyday distractions, I found myself talking to God most all the time. I was grateful the retreat gave me this precious time to experience God's love anew.

I was one of the 1,200 virtual attendees for Assembly and am grateful all the sessions were recorded. Being at home, interruptions did not allow experiencing all sessions live. Janet Wolf, author of the Mission u book, *Practicing Resurrection*, was one of the main speakers. She was outstanding and here are a few of her quotes:

"In a world gone bad, people are to look at us and see the alternative."

"None are free until all are free."

She said God has a vision for the world. A place where:

"Love triumphs over division."

"Folks the world labels as nobodies, discover we are God's somebody, wonderful, precious beloved, awesomely and wonderfully made"

"We are called to embody the vision of God HERE and NOW. The world waits for the church to really be the Body of Christ Jesus. We are the body of Christ when we live out the radically inclusive love of Christ Jesus. And when we stand against all that threatens to diminish, destroy, or belittle any part of God's good creation. God cries for justice. He calls us to go and promises to be with us.

Go show our faith by our actions! Turn dreams into reality!"

READ AND SHARE BEFORE IT IS GONE!

Like many of you I have a tendency to choose books from the newest list of books for the reading program. However this year we can still read from lists clear back to 2015. We have been given an extra year on it! So I thought I should see if there were books I had missed from that year. I found this one, RETURN TO SENDER, by Julia Alvarez. Even though it is a youth social action novel, I highly recommend it. It is an easy read yet is full of no easy answers but also full of hope. It communicates more difficult points of perhaps the most pressing social issue that is still relevant today. After Tyler's father is injured in a tractor accident, his family is forced to hire migrant Mexican workers to help save their Vermont farm from foreclosure. The family needs work but must hide in fear of deportation to Mexico. Their meeting is a stroke of luck for both families, but there are questions: Is Mari's family undocumented? Did Tyler's family break the law by hiring them? This novel shows how friendship can reach across borders and addresses several family and current issues.

The following are also books on that 2015 list that I highly recommend if you have not yet read them. They still have much to offer. Be sure to include the children's books in your reading since they have timeless messages that can easily be shared as devotions or lessons. And get a copy for your Sunday School to use too!

1 - My all time favorite children's book that does this for ALL ages is THE CHICKENS BUILD A WALL by Jean-Francois Dumont. It is a nurturing for community category book. When a friendly hedgehog visits the farm, the chickens build an enormous wall to keep out other "prickly invaders."

2 - THE ROUND HOUSE by Louise Erdrich is a nurturing for community novel that is based on Native American lifestyle. This is the story of Joe, whose life is irrevocably transformed one spring day when his mother is attacked. As she takes to her bed, Joe is increasingly alone and finds himself thrust prematurely into an adult world for which he is ill prepared. (Does contain some provocative language.)

3 - TOUGH COOKIES by Kathy Cloninger and John Wiley has leadership lessons from 100 years of the Girl Scouts and is a leadership book that is full of inspired wisdom. It describes Girl Scouts' transformative journey to become an integrated, unified movement for girls. It captures the essence of this iconic institution and the principles that have sustained its success. "Millions of American businesswomen, thought leaders and politicians received their first lessons in salesmanship, money management, marketing, teamwork and fulfillment from Girl Scouts - as will millions more to come."

4 - SUM IT UP by Pat Summitt is another leadership gem you do not want to miss. Pat Summitt, a country girl from Henrietta, Tennessee, grew up driving fast and playing hard, learning basketball playing with a homemade backboard against three brothers. She went on to win an Olympic medal and at 22 became head coach of the University of Tennessee Lady Vols. Her autobiography tells the whole story, full of humanity, wit and fierceness, along with her struggle with Alzheimer's disease.

5 - THE PROMISE by Nicola Davies is a social action children's book. "On a mean street in a mean city, a young thief tries to snatch an old woman's bag. But the old woman won't let it go until the girl promises something in return. That promise is the beginning of a journey that will change her life and a chance to change the world for good."

6 - I CAN PRAY by Suzette T. Caldwell is a simple spiritual growth children's book that will remind children and ALL of us that as we go about our day, there is always time to pray. So simple and so vital!




