Recently my sister, Sherry, received a breast cancer diagnosis. After the initial shock from receiving the news, she shared with me that she was not afraid because her faith is strong.

Her concern was for the potential threat this diagnosis posed for her two daughters and me!

Aside from health concerns, there seems to be much to be afraid of these days. The news almost daily has headlines announcing mass shootings, threats to our democracy, rampant racism, wars, pandemics, and stories of children and women being abused.

Often I find myself becoming depressed while watching the news or reading the newspaper.

I wonder what I, one woman, can do to make a difference. And then God reminds me that “the Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid!”

Through United Women in Faith, we have an opportunity to make a difference in the lives of women, children and youth who too often find themselves in harms way. Through our giving we support National Mission Institutions that reach out to help those who find themselves in dire circumstances. As we join our voices in protest against laws and practices that threaten the well-being of our sisters and brothers, we take a stand for the least of these.

In spite of what you believe about the 2nd amendment, do not all humans have a right to live without fear of being killed while grocery shopping or going to the mall, do not children have a right to attend school without practicing live shooter drills, do not parents have a right to expect their children to be safe wherever they are?

Is health care a basic human right? Do children have a right to be born into homes where they are loved and cherished? Do we really believe and practice what Jesus taught when he said, “love your neighbor as yourself,” “pray for those who harm you,” “love your enemies?”

I believe that God is calling United Women in Faith for just such a time as this! We have voices! Let’s use them to advocate for all those who face discrimination, threats of violence, poor health care, hunger and homelessness. Let’s be willing to sacrifice and live simply so others may simply live.

I pledge to stop letting fear get in the way of doing what is right, to speak up and to join with those who believe in a God who loves, forgives and saves! After all, our God of love and grace will be our Helper!

The amazing grace of God continues to surround the ministry of the Lucille Raines Residence. We continue to celebrate the work that God is doing in the lives of our residents as they seek to heal and recover from their addictions. One of the gifts of this year has been the production of a book, *A Road to Hope*, that tells the stories of some of our residents as they journey to recovery. We are thankful to Sarah Busch Spearman for this wonderful resource.

We continue to move forward with Love Lifted Me, our accessibility campaign. The goal for the campaign is \$750,000. The purpose is to make the residence more accessible and to replace the elevator in our six story building which can no longer be repaired. We are grateful for the pledges made and the funds that have already been given.

We experienced a great sadness this summer when there was a fire in the building and one of our residents lost her life. We continue to hold her family in our prayers. We are grateful to

God that there were no other victims and that the fire was contained and did not do more damage. We praise God for the fire fighters and others who provided help and support. We will have some significant expense for restoration from the fire damage.

When the United Methodist Women of Indiana established the Lucille Raines Residence to assist people recovering from addictions, there was a real need for this ministry. In the forty-five years that Raines has been a resource for recovery, the need for such ministry has increased greatly. In these difficult times it is a challenge to be in ministry and to find the funding to continue. God is always faithful and has always provided ways for ministry to continue and that has always been true for Raines. Now, as United Women in Faith, we have the opportunity to continue to be part of God's way for ministry to continue at Raines and in many other ways.

Next spring we will have an anniversary event to celebrate forty-five years in ministry. We look forward to having many more anniversaries to celebrate God's work in the lives of people recovering from addictions. Watch for the announcements and join us in celebrating what has been accomplished and looking forward to the amazing future God has for all of us as we mount up with wings as eagles, run without weariness and walk with God.



Also, I will bring copies to the October Annual Program of the new list of reading program books for 2023. National is not posting the new list until sometime in September so we hope to have that ready for you by October.

You will be seeing price increases on resources like the Prayer Guide and Program Resource. Prices haven't increased in the past decade but current widespread price increases of materials in addition to cost of producing have caused this change. Hybrid options have also required investing in digital materials. They are working on offering bundled prices and new, lower shipping options in addition to increasing digital program enhancements. Watch for these new changes and options.

Be sure to get a copy from Lucille Raines Residence of 'A Road to Hope' by Sarah Spearman! It is \$15 and the funds will go for residents emergency use. Sarah interviews 9 LRR residents and it is very good and insightful. We are being very flexible and counting this book towards our reading program in Indiana - either Social Action or Nurturing for Community. Thanks to Sarah for this project!

Remember, the Faith Talks podcasts are plentiful and interesting and approximately 1 hour long. Listening to two of these counts as one Spiritual Growth book. Listening to three podcasts is equal to a Bonus Book in the Spiritual Growth category, and Bonus Books are equal to two books in that category.

Please continue reading and listening in the coming year and share with others to spread all the educational information and programs, as well as expanding your spiritual growth! This year the 2021 and 2022 book selections can be from the 2015 through 2021-2022 reading lists and many are available for Kindle and/or audible. Some of you are reading on a 2-year plan and will report your progress in February 2023 for 2021 and 2022. Others have finished a reading plan in 2021 and already reported it this year. The names of the readers will be posted in the Annual Meeting Program Book. Congratulations to all participants!

Indiana is a ROCK STAR in conference giving. Although we only fulfilled 75% of our annual pledge of \$310,000. We made the largest Legacy donation of any conference with \$54,551.48 in donations. We had the 10th largest total conference contribution at \$292,373.06.

In 2021, UWF awarded \$3,125,992.47 in grants, \$394,865.71 in scholarships and \$563,630.62 in supplemental gifts.

With the rebranding came additional opportunities for giving. Targeted giving to three specific areas is an option. Mission u is an engaging educational opportunity each summer that is funded by your contributions. The Youth and Young Adult Service Scholarship Fund provides scholarships toward work, study or travel experiences that develop leadership in Youth & Young Adult Ministries of Indiana Conference UMC.

When you are giving, please continue to write "United Methodist Women" when sending checks to your local unit, district or conference. We recently received information at the conference level from National on establishing a Doing Business As (DBA) name using "United Women in Faith" instead of "United Methodist Women". Once the conference DBA is established, then the districts and local units can officially switch if desired.



In 2021, the UN Secretary-General António Guterres said that the Intergovernmental Report on Climate Change is “Code Red for Humanity” yet Duke, and AES Indiana have not pledged to retire all of their coal plants before 2030.
