

## Paid Family Leave

As you know, throughout United Methodist Women history, economic justice concerns have been a key component of our mission, and each year at Mission U we encourage participants to build on that legacy by taking action. Last year we collected postcards to send to Wendy's asking the corporate office to address wage and compensation issues in



their supply chain. This year, we are partnering with Family Values at Work to advocate for paid family and medical leave – primarily with the bipartisan FAMILY Act. And our action doesn't stop with Mission U. You will continue to see information about this at the conference annual celebration and possibly at your district annual celebration too.

You can find the information you need to become informed about the Paid Family Leave issue at <https://unitedmethodistwomen.org/leave>.

This information should be passed along to your local UMWs and to your congregation. The action is simple – we need to educate ourselves and then encourage our congressional representatives at both the state and federal level (that means write a letter or several letters!) As daughters, nieces, and mothers many of us have been in the situation where someone needed care and we had to juggle providing care for a loved one and keeping our job. That is what this is about. 

We were asked to forget about ourselves, read the Book of Mark and think about the passages from different points of view. It's an important lesson as we navigate daily interactions with people.

During the "What About Our Money?" study, we read about what the people of Israel were instructed to do. 1). Gather only what they needed, 2). Not accumulate manna for the next day and 3). Observe the Sabbath. What would our lives be like if followed one of those rules faithfully?

I hope others were positively impacted by attending Mission u and I'm looking forward to next year. Continue to keep all the leaders of UMW at all levels in your prayers and continue to uplift each other. A quick update on our funding levels. We have fulfilled 35.66% of our \$310,000 pledge to National through



July. We have five more months to meet our goal. Thanks to everyone who has contributed so far.

Two: You will experience a painful sharpening from time to time, by going through various problems in life, but you'll need it to become a stronger person.


Three: You will be able to correct any mistakes you might make.


## Mission U


