We have a new opportunity in United Women in Faith in Indiana – we can combine what worked in the past, toss out what didn't work, and find new ways of being in mission and advocacy with women, children, and youth. changes reflected in the 2026 conference standing rules and the standing rules for the new districts.

Be sure to attend the Annual Celebration the first weekend of October in Westfield (just north of Indianapolis) when we will formally create the new districts and you will have a chance to be in on the brainstorming to get those districts fired up! Lots of decisions to be made and you need to be there to help make those decisions. Invest in our future with your ideas. We will have elections for leadership, approve standing rules, and vote on budgets - and we will start those new districts MOVING FORWARD WITH HOPE AND GRACE.

#### FROM THE LANGUAGE COORDINATORS

Do you think about labels? And we are not asking about food nutrition labels! We mean labeling groups of people. Sometimes we need to use labels for ease of communicating about a large group. But many times, even our well-intentioned grouping may indicate a lack of understanding. For example, we commonly use the term "Hispanic" or "Latinx" to refer to someone of Spanish or Latin ancestry. That is fine as long as we also understand that there are HUGE differences amongst people from different Hispanic or Latin countries!

Margaret's Hispanic ancestry is from Puerto Rico while Ashley's is from Mexico (with Puerto Rican influence). So, their experiences are unique, their music and food and culture are different. Even their

Spanish can be different! Think of it as similar to lumping all English-speaking countries together. Yet, we know that British English has differences from American English. Americans have different history and traditions than Irish or Canadians. So just as you take pride in being American, not just Anglo, offer the same understanding to those of Hispanic, Asian, Native, or African descent. Keep this in mind next time you are speaking with someone from a different ancestry or cultural tradition. Try to get to know them and their specific culture. You may be surprised at how much you can learn!

Our Units are very active and do so much for missions locally, statewide, nationally and internationally. We want to make sure that all Units receive credit for all they do! Units will be recognized as follows:

**Gold** with 16 items completed including 6 asterisked items

**Silver** with 12 items completed including 6 asterisked items

**Bronze** with 8 items completed including 6 asterisked items

We will also have a participation level for those Units not quite making the Bronze level.

In January, I revised the Mission Today form but made a mistake. Thanks to Margaret Dennis for catching my mistake. Under the section marked "Gifts" for 2025, there was a change in the Member Askings for 2025 in the 2025 Standing Rules.

At the October, 2024 United Women in Faith Annual Meeting, it was voted to increase the Member Askings to \$18 per member when it is not the year before Assembly. Raines was increased to \$15,

Mission u stayed at \$2, Youth and Young Adult Scholarship remained at \$1 for a total of \$18 per member when it is not the year before Assembly. The year before Assembly, an extra \$1 will be added for Assembly expenses. This will be included the year prior to Assembly only. Since Assembly occurs in 2026, the extra \$1 would be included in the Askings for 2025.



#### **LUCILLE RAINES RESIDENCE**

The Lucille Raines Residence is an outgrowth of Esther Hall, once located at 1241 North New Jersey Street in Indianapolis. Esther Hall was purchased in 1938 as a "home away from home" for young women and was first operated by the

Deaconess Board of the Indiana Conference of the Methodist Church, then later by the Woman's Society of Christian Service. With a maximum capacity of 20, it had become too small for the needs of the community, so a joint committee of the WSCS of the Indiana, North Indiana, and Northwest Indiana conferences was appointed to consider the location and financing of a new residence. The first meeting of its board of directors was held on October 30, 1967, and at that time the name Esther Hall, Inc. was adopted.

Because of the staggering cost of a new building, construction was delayed until 1969, when the old Nottingham Hotel at 947 North Pennsylvania Street was purchased and renovated. Expansion included a large recreation area, dining area, and



new kitchen, which along with the original 55 guest rooms made the new facility an excellent one. Construction was completed in 1970 with a total cost, including purchase and furnishings, of \$630,000.



Funds for the home came first from the women of the Indiana Conference, the National Division of the Board of Global Ministries, the Women's Division of the Boards of Missions, Bishop Richard and Lucille Raines, and individual contributions. A loan was secured and preparation was made to change the name to Lucille Raines Residence in honor of Mrs. Raines and her family.

On May 2, 1970 Lucille Raines Residence officially opened with this purpose: "To provide a home away from home with no restrictions as to race, creed or national origin for young women of college age (17 to 30) who are away from home to attend school or to work. Every attempt is made to create an atmosphere of Christian love and concern

# Some hard truths about home ownership

You know that
United Women in Faith
of Indiana are the owners of the Lucille Raines

as the owners we have
bills to pay – must keep
the lights on, the staff

that comes with ownership of this particular
home.

We (UWFaith of Indiana) have budgeted \$8,500 per month to keep this ministry running.

Which means we need to have the local units send in their askings (the annual amount we ask for PER MEMBER) to their district treasurer in a timely manner - don't wait until the end of the year! And be aware that the askings do not cover the total so we need the creative thinkers out there to find ways to top up their donations. And remember that your first choice when emptying the treasury at the end of the year should be Lucille Raines Residence.

Tea with Lucille? How about a charcuterie board auction before the World Series? Casserole sale on the Sunday before school starts? What other ideas can you come up with?



in which residents will be given a measure of supervision and guidance. The program in the residence will reflect the efforts of young women working together to develop their own meaningful activities..." Violet E. Carleson was appointed its first director, room and board was set at \$100 a month for a double room, and full occupancy (81) was reached by September.

But "the times they were a changin'." By 1976 with Susan Gindelberger as its director, the home was in financial trouble, though through no fault of Ms. Gindelberger's. The three main problems that it faced were (1) difficulty in keeping it at full occupancy, which was a direct result of (2) the changing lifestyles of young women and their unwillingness to live in a structured group home, and (3) rising operating costs. So the board of directors of the home recommended that it be closed as of December 31, 1976.

Yet even at this, its darkest hour, work was already in motion to save the home. Through the joint sponsorship of the Indiana Area United Methodist Women and the Salvation Army, the Lucille Raines Residence reopened in May 1977 as a Community Involvement Center. It was to be used by persons completing substance abuse programs, persons in treatment with the mental health system, and women in crisis as a phase between institutional and independent living. Though staffed and run by the Salvation Army Social Center, it still remained the property of the Indiana United Methodist Women, who continued responsibility for its ultimate welfare.

From 1977 to the present the mission of the Lucille Raines Residence has remained much the same, with the addition of those requiring sightless training and those prisoners on work release to its residents. With a \$4 per member donation the UMW of the North and the South Indiana conferences continue their support by providing half of its operating expenses. Funding, however, is always a problem, particularly with the steady decline in the number of United Methodist Women.

Carolyn Marshall, its current executive director, has been actively involved in its welfare for the past 25 years and is largely responsible for its continued operation. The best testimony of its worth is in the words of one of the thousands that it has helped over the years: ... "From nothing emerged something, chaos was transformed to order, from nobody came somebody and from nowhere I was definitely somewhere..."

# Faith Community to Hold Prayer Vigil for Immigrant Community at Miami Correctional Facility

Clergy, church leaders, and people of faith will gather outside Miami Correctional Facility on Monday, August 25 at 2:00 p.m. for a public prayer vigil in support of the immigrant community and in lament for the immigrant detention system.

According to the CATO Institute, "65 percent of people taken by IC had no convictions, 93 percent no violent convictions." The language being used related to the use of the Miami Correctional Facility for immigrant detainees is deeply troubling. We also pray and urge our elected leaders to pursue transparency, accountability, and policies rooted in compassion and justice.

Leaders from The Indiana Conference of The United Methodist Church are hosting this vigil, which will welcome other faith traditions. The gathering will include Scripture readings, songs, and prayer calling for compassion, dignity, and justice for immigrants and refugees. Those in attendance will stand in prayerful solidarity with the immigrant communities and call attention to the urgent need for humane treatment of all people.

Bishop Tracy Smith Malone of the Indiana United Methodist Church recently wrote, "Many in our [Indiana] Conference have expressed deep concerns about what such facilities would mean for justice, compassion, and the God-given dignity of every person—especially those who are most vulnerable among us. As the body of Christ, we must not remain silent in the face of language or policy that diminishes human dignity."

We will gather to pray for those who are detained, for their families, and for a system that better reflects mercy, justice, and love.


