AUGUST 10 FREE SCHOOL PHYSICALS NEEDS YOUR HELP


We have supported the Physicals for many years, recognizing that in addition to providing the school physical exams these uninsured children need that they will get a backpack of school supplies and will also get vision and dental screening. We can never have too many school supplies because all those extras for the physicals will be donated the following elementary schools, Garfield, Crestwood and Lynbrook and two Springfield family centers and ECHO.

Stop at the **Fellowship Hall Table** to check the many sign up lists to see how you can sign up to help. Different days, times and ways to fit different schedules are available. Lists of needed school supplies are also on the table. Cash or check donations are also very welcome. Make checks payable to St. Christopher's with School supplies on the memo line. The school supply sales probably have already started.

Help needed lists include the following:

Agents of Ministry Needed! – Service is another way to involve oneself at St. Christopher's Parish. Every year we have a Ministry Fair that sheds light on some of the many opportunities available for people, but currently we have space on a couple of our teams where we need additional members (for all of these Fr. Peter can be your point of contact at [rectorpete "at" gmail.com](mailto:rectorpete@gmail.com)):

1). **Ushers** – Please see any usher for the duties involved in the position. You will be assigned to a team and serve at one of our later services once per month on average. We are also looking for a new Lead Usher who will, schedule the teams for each month; attend the quarterly Worship Committee Meetings; and help communicate any needs from the Worship Team to the ushers. If interested in either of these positions (Usher and or Head Usher) please see Fr. Peter!

2). **Greeters** – This is a vital ministry as the Greeter is the first person encountered by many at any given service. Generally Greeters serve at the later service on Sundays. Their role is to “greet” people, direct visitors to facilities, seating, and childcare, and basically be a welcoming presence for those on Sunday. Greeters begin 15 minutes before service time and may proceed to worship about 5 minutes after the service begins. If interested please see Virginia Clark or contact Fr. Peter.

3). **Lay Eucharistic Visitors** – These are the members of the parish who take communion to our homebound members. There are certain criteria to become a LEV (or PAT as we call them), including a willingness to take the necessary training to be licensed by the Diocese of Virginia. This is a very ministerial role that will place the LEV in regular contact (about every six weeks or so) with shut-ins from our parish. The first step to discerning if this is a ministry for you is to meet with Fr. Peter

ECHO is looking for a new Teen Program Lead. The Teen Program Lead is responsible for scheduling adult Teen Program supervisors (at least two every week), volunteering time to supervise the teens, manage the teen program email inbox, approving volunteer hours as they come into the inbox and coordinate with ECHO department chairs to ensure there is a list of tasks for the teens each week. When volunteering as a teen supervisor, the individual will be responsible for working with the other teen supervisors to assign tasks to the teens, instruct the teens on what to do with each task and generally watch over the teens to ensure problems do not arise.
