NEWTON SUMMER PROGRAM 2022

REGISTRATION DETAILS: PLEASE Read Carefully

REQUIREMENTS FOR PROGRAM: Open to children who are **currently completing K-6th grade**. Newton residents have priority until May 1st. **Non-residents cannot receive scholarships.** Residents are children who live in one of these towns year-round or during the summer months.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:

1. **Registration is open immediately and ends** when the program has 30 enrolled or June 6th. Forms will be processed in the order they are received. You can drop off summer registration forms with Jennie Friedman, The Newton School 243 VT-132, South Strafford, VT 05070.
2. **Please send ½ of your summer payment with your registration forms to secure a spot for your child. Or complete the subsidy/scholarship request form.**
3. Registration Forms must be complete. Participants with incomplete forms will be put on a waiting list and parent/guardian will be notified.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE: If you cannot afford the summer fee, we ask families to first apply for Child Care Assistance through the Family Place, 802-649-3268. Please do this well in advance (by mid-May). If your family does not qualify for state assistance, please refer to the Financial Assistance form for more information. We are asking for a minimum pay of \$25/week per child.

MEALS: A healthy snack, lunch and an afternoon snack will be provided each day. A menu calendar will be provided at the beginning of the summer.

SWIMMING LESSONS: We will be taking students to Upper Valley Aquatic Center 3 days a week, July 18-29. Students who are signed up for both weeks will be given priority these weeks.

MONDAY, JULY 4: There will be no program on July 4th.

INTERVENTION BLOCK: Like last year, we will offer an academic block to students who need reading and/or math intervention. We will notify families if your child is referred. This block will run July 11-August 4, 8:15-10:15am, M-TH. This portion of the day is free of charge, so if your child just participates in the intervention block, they do not need to pay a fee.

ITEMS TO BRING EACH DAY: Sunscreen & Hat, Sneakers, Bathing Suit & Towel, Water Bottle, Extra T-Shirts & Shorts, Reading Book, Bag Lunch (only if your child does not want served lunch). No need for snacks—we will provide a healthy snack. Some students prefer to bring goggles and PFDs /life jackets for swim trips. **Please leave personal toys at home.**

ONE PLANET FIELD TRIPS & SPECIAL EVENTS



Off-site field trips are an important part of our summer program. We believe exposing participants to new experiences and places is essential to the development of sense of self and community.

We live in a beautiful place, so we will make time to cool down in our local pools and ponds, as well as explore our local hiking and nature trails on a weekly basis.

In addition, we will schedule one full-day field trip per week to a special location. In our theme descriptions, we have done our best to identify the location by week, but location may be subject to change due to availability, weather, etc. If we need to change a field trip location, we will communicate this change as soon as possible with parents. If you are interested in volunteering, we always welcome parent/guardian chaperones. Please be in touch with your site's Coordinator.

NEWTON THEMES

July 5 - 8: Art & the Elements

Earth, Water, Air, and Fire! The four elements are all around us. But how are the four elements related to art? During this week of camp, we will explore the four elements and create art based around them. Some activities may include: nature lessons and survival skills, paper airplanes and other flying art, watercolor painting, making art with objects found in the environment, and much more.

FIELD TRIPS: Swim Trip; VINS

July 11 - 15: Hidden Treasure

This will be a fun week combining geocaching with exploring the local area. We will be hiking, roaming through fields and forests in search of treasure! Campers will learn about the fun of geocaching and making small things to leave behind for others. We will create our own geocaches throughout the week along with lots of scavenger hunts. **FIELD TRIPS: Swim Trip; ECHO & Ethan Allen Cruise**

July 18 - 22: S.T.E.M.

This broad topic will lend itself to a wide range of hands-on activities that introduce students to basic and more advanced Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematical concepts. All activities to be designed with the intent to grow critical thinking skills, problem-solving skills and perseverance. In addition, we will focus on giving campers authentic choice, allowing them to explore and create based on their interests.

FIELD TRIPS: Swimming Lessons at UVAC

July 25 - 29: Water World

Water makes up 70% of the world and our bodies! It is one of Earth's most important resources and impacts daily life in a myriad of interesting, engaging and even hilarious ways! During this week, kids will have the opportunity to participate in STEM, art, natural history and life science lessons exploring topics such as PH, density, chemical composition, salinity, engineering with water, etc. There will also be the opportunity to engage in plenty of water games and activities to help beat the heat!

FIELD TRIPS: Swimming Lessons at UVAC

Aug 1 - 5: Showtime!

Using classics or contemporary stories, we'll create scripts, characters, costumes, scenery and soundtracks to put on a show! Either we'll make a play or a puppet show with campers able to participate in all the arts of drama, including scriptwriting, acting, coaching, directing, costuming, scene-setting, prop-making, puppet-making, character-development, and stage/theater production.

FIELD TRIPS: Swim Trip; Get Air

Step 1: Apply for Child Care Financial Assistance

To be eligible for assistance your family must:

- 1) Have an accepted service need (reason) for childcare; AND
- 2) Meet current income guidelines (Gross monthly income not to exceed \$5,195 for 3 person family, \$6275 for 4 person family, \$7355 for 5 person family, \$8435 for 6+ person family).

We ask any family that meets the above eligibility requirements to apply for Child Care Financial Assistance before requesting a scholarship. To apply, parents/guardians must contact the Family Place at 802-649-3268 or go to <http://www.familyplacevt.org/child-care/>.

If you are applying for financial aid, your camp registration will be considered incomplete until you have submitted a complete application to the Family Place and have signed below OR if you can provide evidence that your family would not be eligible for Child Care Financial Assistance.
