

How Is the Lock Down Affecting You?

Paul was a hard-nosed leader. We remember his rejection of Mark on the second missions trip (Acts 15:39). The old Apostle did not mince words when it came to Judaizers (Philippians 3:2f). He even names believers who went wayward (2 Timothy 1:15). The specially chosen apostle pointed out the hypocrisy of Peter on occasion (Galatians 2:11-14), but when it came to those dearest to him he showed a special kind of care.

That care showed itself in giving medical advice to Timothy (1 Timothy 5:23). Paul was especially grieved for Epaphroditus in his illness (Philippians 2:25-29). He encouraged saints to welcome back a wayward believer (2 Corinthians 2:5-11). The imprisoned apostle affirmed Phoebe the deaconess (Romans 16:1). The apostle who needed an introduction (Acts 9:26-27) would often, in his letters, introduce fellow servants of Jesus Christ. (Romans 16:21; 1 Corinthians 16:12-20; Ephesians 6:21-22; Colossians 4:10-17; & Titus 3:12-14)



Where am I going with this study of the ministry of Paul? Paul demonstrates a compassionate caring while at the same time calling a spade a spade. It is tempting for folks in ministry to become lopsided. We can see everything as a conspiracy and take up arms to denounce them. Another reaction is to fret to the degree that we give up encouraging folks around us.



In December I am asking a couple sharp gals to join the Pastor Clusters for our Venture Church Network. They are my pastor's wife and my associate pastor's wife. I trust that their experiences of living in parsonages during Covid will spark conversations in our homes. I have seen a toll in parsonages coming from the stress of divided churches and boards; frustrations of not meeting in person; having little if any children's and youth ministries or even funerals. There is the compounding of doubts concerning what is happening to the flock.
