

Dear CB North Central Churches,

This February will be two years since I started at Eureka Baptist Church in St. Croix Falls, WI. My wife, daughter, and I have grown to love the area, and even more so the people over that time period. One emphasis from day one was to build a church on the Word of God. What this means is that we were not going to draw people based on what programs we had, or what kind of music we played, or entertaining preaching. Rather, the Word would be preached, and in everything we do Scripture would be the focus and God's people would hear and be a part of our fellowship. Jesus makes clear that the people of God hear

His voice and follow Him (John 10:27). We have seen both believers hungry for a church built on biblical centrality come, and also unbelievers whom the Lord leads to us as people in our congregation invite them. For the first 137 years of the church's history the church constitution made it so that there was one pastor and multiple deacons. While this is a good way to lead a church, Scripture makes quite clear that in the first century church a plurality of elders oversaw a local church (Titus 1:5; Acts 20:28). For one shepherd to look after a whole flock, even at a small church, is quite a burden. So as we examined the Scriptures more closely. A couple of months back Eureka Baptist voted unanimously to add a plurality of elders for the first time in the church's long history. To have this unity from the whole flock at Eureka was quite a sight to see. We saw the Lord's fingerprints all over it! For the past couple of months, we have had three elders (me being one) look after the flock at Eureka Baptist. As one who was once the lone shepherd here, I am very grateful for this development.
