<u>ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL</u> – <u>School opens on Tuesday, September 2nd, for all students</u>. For security purposes, the only access points to the building each morning will be the main entrance and the middle school wing entrance (located on the far side of the building, behind the BOE office). Those two entrances will be manned with greeters and will be available for access from 7:00 am until 7:50 am. Following the start of school at 7:50 am, all students, parents, and visitors entering the building will be required to be buzzed in through the main entrance and visitor vestibule.

<u>STUDENT DROP-OFF</u> – For students who will be driven to school, the best way to drop off is by following the traffic pattern down Wampum Road. Students can also be dropped off by using the parking spaces along Park Avenue. Please do not allow your child to cross the road on their own. There is a crossing guard stationed in front of the school building. Students should walk to the crossing guard where they can be crossed safely to enter the building. Please do not use the Post Office parking lot to drop off or pick up students. Police will be stationed there and will give tickets for the improper use of that lot.

<u>HALLWAY LOCKERS</u> – Every student at PRHS is assigned a hallway locker for the school year. Student locker numbers can be found at the top of their class schedule. Students will need two locks for use during the school year. One can be placed on their hallway locker, and the other will be used to secure their belongings in the locker room during physical education classes. Students are required to lock their hallway lockers during the school day.

<u>LUNCH</u> – Students can purchase lunch as well as additional snacks and drinks from the cafeteria. Families are encouraged to join the PRHS Online Cashless Payment Option for lunch. Details and directions for the program can be found on the High School website. As always, students are welcome to bring their own lunch from home if they prefer. Information on the school's cafeteria and applications for the free and reduced meals can be found on our district website under "nutrition programs."

<u>UNDERCLASS/STAFF YEARBOOK PHOTOS</u> – School photos will be taken for students in grades 7 – 11 on <u>Thursday, September 4th</u>, during their physical education class.

<u>LAPTOP DISTRIBUTION</u> – For those who are not aware, the new student laptops are in and ready for distribution. Students are encouraged to pick up their laptops before the start of school. Laptop distribution is taking place in the High School Technology Office (located on the second floor above the library), Monday – Thursday from 9 am - 2 pm through August 28th. Students who are unable to pick up their machines during these dates and times will have to pick them up after school from 2:45 – 3:15 pm on September 2nd or 3rd. Please be advised that wait times after school may be long, and pick up during summer hours is preferred.

There's so much to look forward to in 2025–2026 — new opportunities, continued traditions, and countless moments that will remind us why PRHS is such a special place. Enjoy these last few days of summer, and let's get ready to make this year one of achievement and growth!
