LEVITICUS 19:1 – 20:27

Mitzvot



38 Negative and 13 Positive

Yahweh spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to the whole Israelite community and tell them: 'You must be holy, for I, Yahweh your God, am holy. Each of you must respect your mother and your father and observe my Sabbaths: I, Yahweh, am your God. Do not turn to idols or make molten deities for yourselves: I, Yahweh, am your God. When you sacrifice a well-being offering to Yahweh, sacrifice it in a way that is acceptable to him.'"



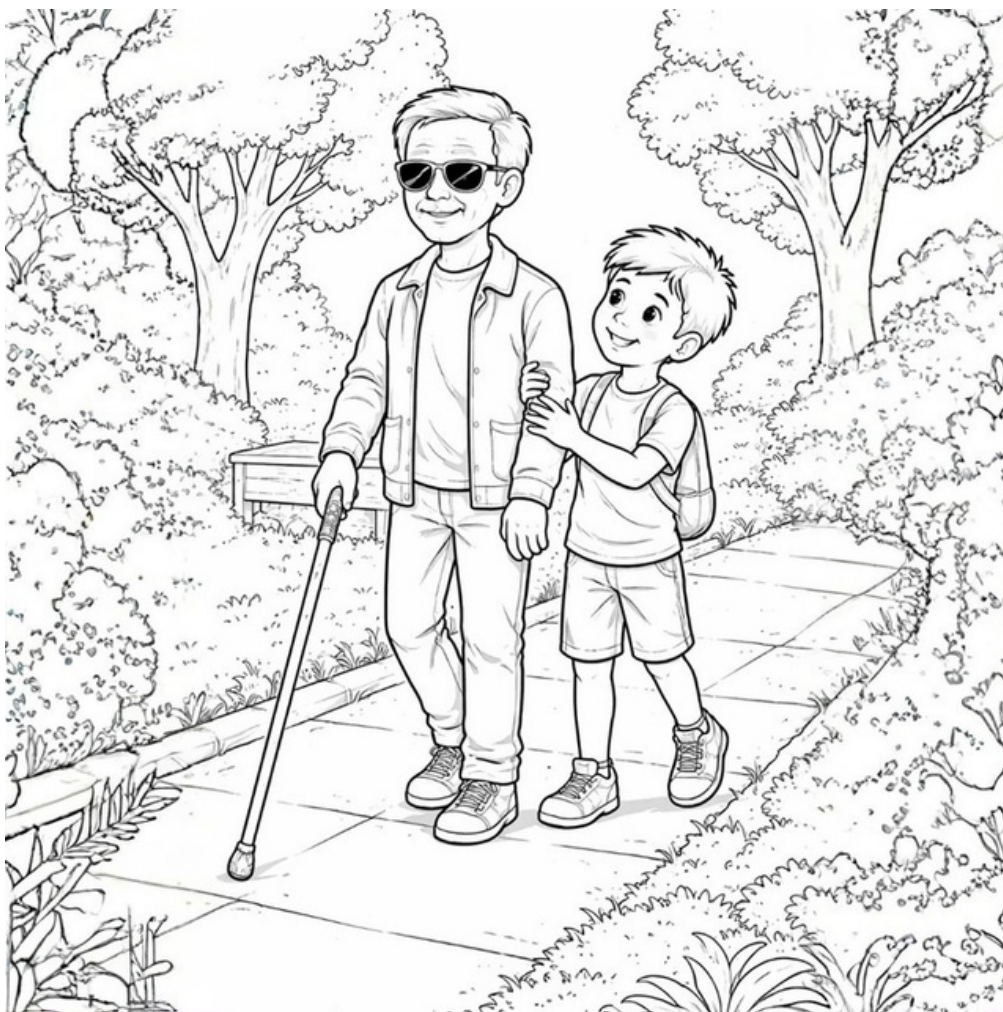


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You shall not glean your vineyard, nor gather the fallen fruit of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the foreigner: I am the Lord their God. You shall not steal; you shall not deal falsely or dishonestly with one another. You shall not swear falsely by my name, profaning the name of your God: I am the Lord. You shall not defraud your neighbor. You shall not commit robbery. The wages of a hired worker shall not remain in your possession until morning. You shall not insult the deaf, nor put a stumbling block before the blind. You shall fear your God: I am the Lord. You shall not render unjust judgment; you shall not show partiality to the poor or deference to the rich, but judge your neighbor fairly. You shall not go about as a slanderer among your people. You shall not despise your neighbor when he is in danger: I am the Lord. You shall not hate your relative in your heart. Rebuke your relative, but do not incur guilt because of them. Do not take revenge or bear a grudge against your fellow Israelites. Love your neighbor as yourself; I am Yahweh. You must keep my statutes. Do not let your livestock mate with another kind; do not sow your field with two kinds of seed; do not wear clothing made of two kinds of material.





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When you enter the land and plant any tree for food, you shall regard its fruit as forbidden. For three years it shall be forbidden to you; you shall not eat it. In the fourth year all its produce shall be set aside as a festive rejoicing before Yahweh; and only in the fifth year may you use its fruit, so that your harvests may increase: I, Yahweh, am your Elohim. You shall not eat anything with its blood. You shall not practice divination or sorcery. You shall not round the edges of your hair or mar the edges of your beard, nor cut your flesh for the dead, nor put any marks on yourselves: I am Yahweh. You shall not degrade your daughter by making her a prostitute, lest the land fall into prostitution and the land be filled with depravity. You shall observe my Sabbaths and venerate my sanctuary: I am Yahweh. The foreigner residing among you shall be to you as one of your citizens; They will love him as themselves, for they were foreigners in the land of Egypt: I am Yahweh your God.





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If anyone insults his father or mother, he shall be put to death; he has insulted his father or mother—his blood guilt is upon him. If a man commits adultery with a married woman, by committing adultery with another man's wife, both the adulterer and the adulteress shall be put to death. If a man marries his sister, the daughter of his father or his mother, so that he sees her nakedness and she sees his nakedness, it is a disgrace; both of them shall be excommunicated in the sight of their relatives. He has uncovered his sister's nakedness; he shall bear his guilt. You shall be holy to me, for I, the Lord, am holy, and I have set you apart from other peoples to be mine.



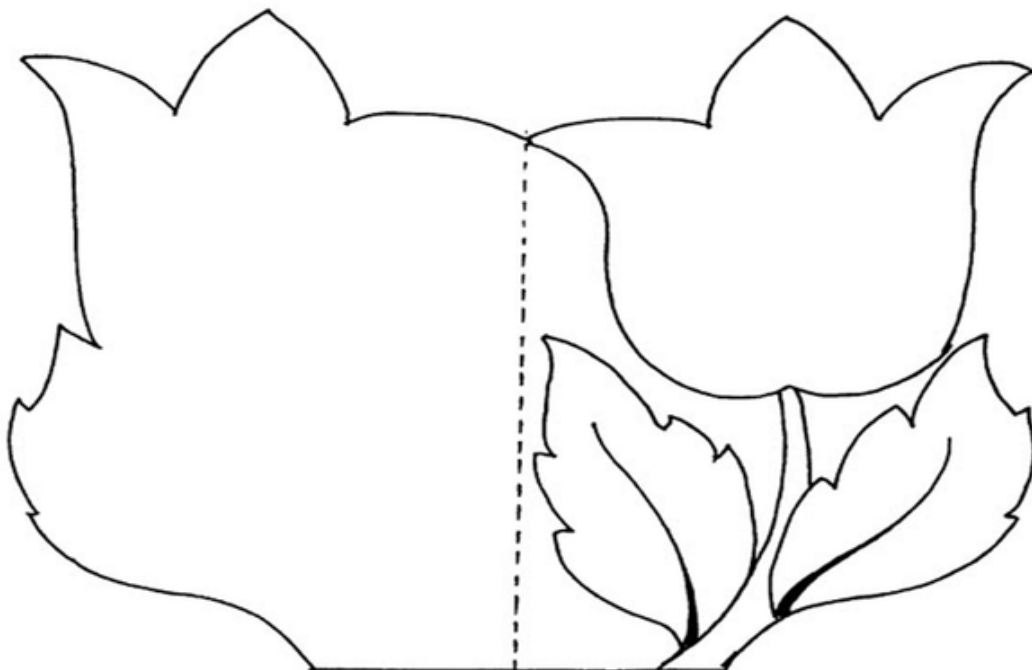
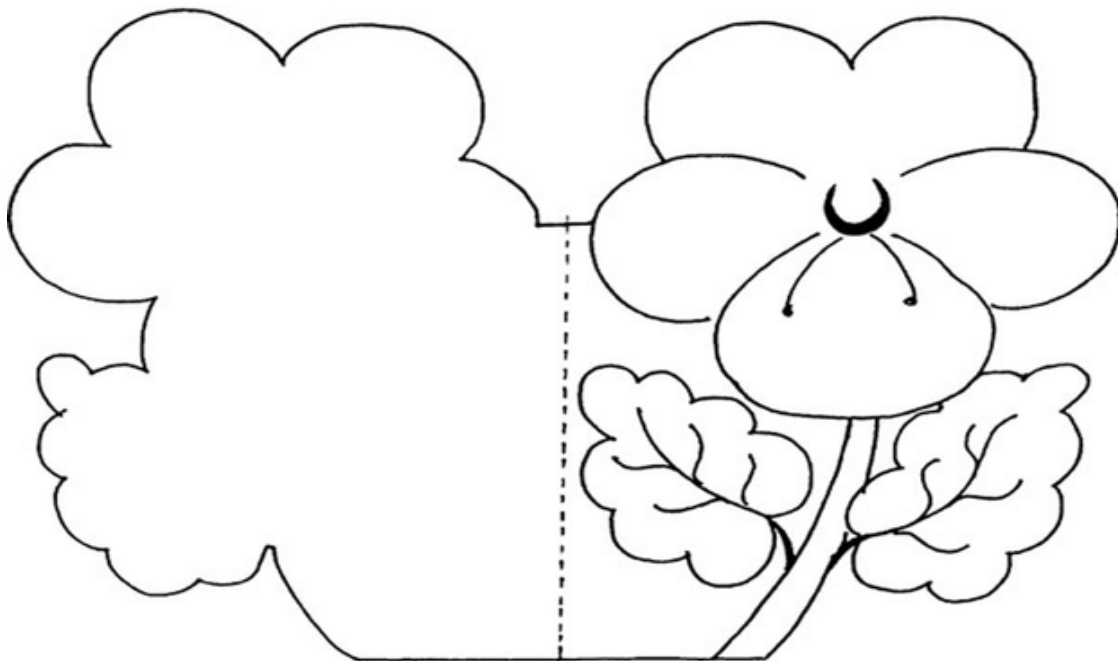


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In this parasha we learned respect for our parents, cut out the card, decorate it and write a Bible verse, and give it to your parents.
