I am sure that Judy will welcome all of your assistance as the food arrives and then at the end of the meeting. Please take home anything that is left from your offering at the end of the meeting.



Orange Coast Unitarian Universalist Church 2845 Mesa Verde Drive East Costa Mesa CA 92627







May 11, 2023 Susie Nash will present a workshop on making the Laura Heine Tiny Quilt collage of a featherweight sewing machine. She is great with ideas on which fabrics work well with others for this project and will show us the best way to fuse the fabrics. This is a reduction of the original pattern. Each pattern finishes at 16" X 20".

June 15, 2023 Rami Kim will teach a "3-D" technique workshop. You will learn 5 of the exotic and unusual methods that are the trademark of Rami's works. These include hexagon and biscuit chopkey, mirror-imaged continuously folded prairie points, harlequin tucks, North American hand smocking and lined prairie points. September 14, 2023. Emily Bailey will present a Jumbo Scrappy Star. Jumbo Scrappy Star is a fun way to explore color, value and design while creating a beautiful quilt. Discover how value gives you control to create pop and interest.
