August will bring us Ann Turley teaching "On Point". This is a fun, easy quilt that only requires 5 fabrics total and you will get a lot done in class if you come with your "homework" done. Ann is a very talented lady who always has some neat trick or two to teach us.



September will bring us Dora Cary teaching "Beads on a String". What a wonderful way to use a layer cake or cut some assorted 10

inch squares to get started on this quilt. Dora is a super lady originally from Romania but now residing in Paso Robles. She will have a kit prepared for you if you pre-order it. Cost - \$45.



October Shelley Swanland will be with us teaching a "Cathedral Window Sampler", Come and see Shelley's various ways of making the cathedral window block. She is the master! And, she will have kits available in the class for \$15.


