I'm writing this the Thursday before Christmas. I'm also packing to go to my daughter's house in Nevada, tomorrow!

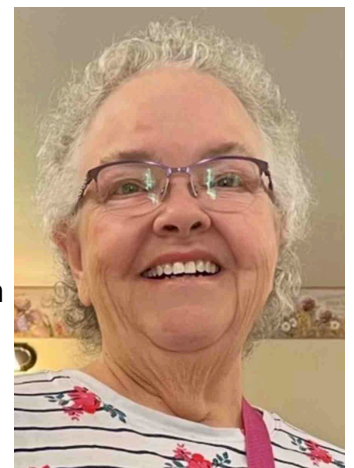

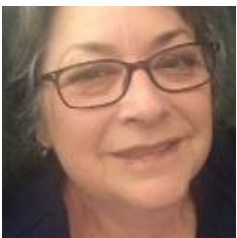


OGQG Facebook Page Reminder!

CAMP PENDELTON TOY DRIVE



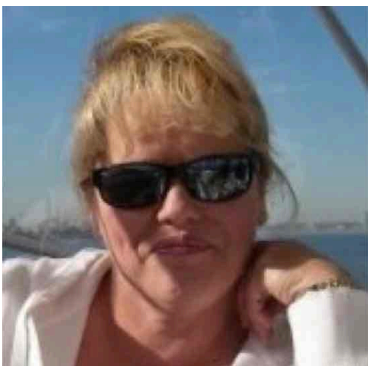

Wishing everyone a very Happy New Year for 2023!! It doesn't seem possible that another year is behind us. The years seem to fly.

We will start our Philanthropy Sew Day the first Wednesday of every month beginning January 4, 2023. We are getting a little behind in the pillowcase kits so I think our first priority will be to make up some new pillowcase kits. There will be fabric available to put together some really cute kits. There are several other projects that need to be completed. These items might be best to take home and work on but you can always check them out and decide. We will take a break from layering and see if we can get some of the odds and ends completed.

We continue to meet at the Driftwood Mobile Home Park from 9:30 to approximately 2:30 at 2561 Beach Blvd., Westminster. You are welcome to stay the whole day or whatever time you have available. Don't forget to bring a lunch and something to drink for lunch. If you would like to bring your machine there is plenty of room and good lighting. Machines are not necessary, there are cutting mats, rotary cutters, rulers, irons and notions available for your use.

There is a variety of projects that hopefully will be of interest. We need infant quilts, children quilts (from toddler to teen), children quilts and patriot quilts for Camp Pendleton, adult quilts, pillowcases and don't forget mug rugs for Meals on Wheels.

The total number of items donated in 2022 was 514, number of quilts was 254 and pillowcases was 260. The Mug Rugs were not counted yet, they will be part of the 2023 number.

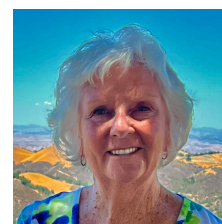
