WE'RE TURNING THE BIG 40

Can you believe Orange Grove Quilters Guild is 40 years old?

It was way back in August of 1982 that a flyer was set out in various fabric shops, classes, and other locations about an inaugural meeting of a new quilt guild. The only other guild in the area was Orange County, which was an evening guild and there had been requests for a daytime guild. The meeting was at the Huntington Beach Central Library. I went even though I had never taken a quilting class. It was something I had always wanted to do and being new to California I thought it would be a good way to meet some nice ladies. The first 100 people to join were given "Charter Member" status. (My number is 40) Blanche Young was the founder and some of the ladies who were in her classes volunteered for board positions. We did have monthly speakers and workshops. The workshops were held at Trinette Shelton's home as she



had a wonderful loft we could use. When Trinette's home wasn't available, we went to Eleanor Haywood's garage.

We held the next several meetings at the library but quickly outgrew the facility and moved to the Knights of Columbus Hall in Garden Grove. After a few months, we had grown so big that we needed to grow again, and we moved to the First Baptist Church of Garden Grove. By that time, we were flush enough to have money to pay for a workshop facility, so we started having both our meetings and the workshops at the church. Many of our members were also members of the church. We were lucky enough to stay at this location for many years.

During this time, we had our first quilt show "Quilts Alive in '85" held at St. Barbara's Church in Santa Ana. I think we had close to 50 different vendors and lots of wonderful quilts. We didn't have another quilt show for five years – can you guess the name – "Another One in '91"! After the success of these two shows, we began having them every other year with another event in the off year. We did Tea and Auctions as well as our famous (or infamous) "Hog Holler" events. Then we decided to have our Sewing Room Tour and Luncheon events.

We made another move in the late 1990s to the United Methodist Church on Main Street in Garden Grove. Parking was wonderful and we had no steps or ramps to navigate. We were moving up in the world. Workshops moved to the mobile home park where Carol Logue lived. We stayed there until the church was doing construction on their property. We relocated our workshops to Westminster Village Club House, our current facility.

Another move, this time to the Garden Grove Elks Lodge, our current home. We've been here for quite a while, and it suits our needs perfectly. We even had two quilt shows here. A real bonus is the on-site restaurant! We really fill the space after our meetings. Over the past 40 years, we have had 32 presidents, 7 of whom served two years and one served three years. We still have 5 charter members out of the original 100. Our numbers have grown, and we are still welcoming new members.

We have had extraordinary speakers/teachers since the beginning. Workshops are still very popular. As a guild we have done numerous bus trips to Road to California, The Reagan Presidential Library and even the Ellen DeGeneres show! We bussed to Quilt in a Day, Rosie's Calico Cupboard and many more places. We even did a trip to Paducah for the big show there. Who knows, maybe one to Houston will be in our future or some other wonderful place! Heck, we even survived Covid moving our meetings and workshops to ZOOM! Board meetings were also done via ZOOM.

How did all of this come about and keep going??? From Blanche Young organizing a group of her students from Lila Bridgers, our first president to Jean Johnson, Monette Utz, Trinette Shelton, Jeanne Young to our current president, Bonnie Lippincott and her fabulous board, that's how! And all the wonderful members who have volunteered their time and efforts through the years. I personally have been lucky enough to have been there from the beginning. I have watched us bloom and grow and we're not done yet. We keep getting better and better. Of course, we have lots some friends through the years, but we have also gained more new lasting friendships.


