At the February meeting, I asked if there was any interest in the Guild sponsoring a quilt retreat in Temecula. There was a positive response and we now have a confirmed date, April 21 - 23, 2025. If you have never been on a quilt retreat before, I can tell you that it is a lot of fun. For three days we will just sew. And chat. And eat meals that we do not have to cook. BLOCK OF THE MONTH CHALLENGE DUE MARCH 13, 2024

Block 1 9" finished star of your choice

Block 2 6" x 9" finished house either vertical or horizontal

Make either or both; remember this is your quilt! Or make even more than one of each.

You will be given a ticket for the drawing for each block you turn in.

This challenge is all about showcasing your creativity, sharing ideas and having fun with fellow quilters, so here's how it works:

There is a \$5.00 fee to join the challenge. The money collected will be the grand prize at the end of the challenge.

Each month we will select two different blocks to make. One will be more traditional and the other will be a bit more challenging. You may make one or both of the blocks.

We will tell you the size to make for each of these blocks. The size of the blocks will differ from month to month.

These are the only two rules you must follow: 1) make the selected blocks and 2) in the sizes stated.

We invite your participation in suggesting blocks you would like to see incorporated in your quilt. We welcome and will consider any and all ideas.

Bring your completed block(s) to guild the following month. We will issue a ticket for each completed block to win a monthly prize. For example, if you completed both blocks, you will have two chances to win the prize.

At the end of the challenge we will draw the winning ticket for the grand prize from all of the previous months' tickets.

In January 2025 we will have a workshop on how to put the blocks together to create your own unique quilt.

We look forward to working with you on this challenge. Please consider joining us to see what each of us will create.



Loose Ends Project

Would you like to finish a quilt for a bereaved family or for someone disabled or too ill to complete it? Two knitters named Masey Kaplan and Jennifer Simonic were visited by their friend, Patti, whose mom had recently died. Among her mother's things were two unfinished blankets for Patti's two brothers: expressions of a mother's love.



Masey and Jennifer wanted to help but the blankets were crocheted, not knitted. They found a crocheter who was glad to complete the project, so that Patti's two brothers could receive the blankets their mom had begun for them.

This led Masey to begin a web site that would match unfinished projects with volunteer quilters, knitters, crocheters, and crafters who would complete the projects. It's called **Loose Ends Project, (looseendsproject.org)** and was begun in August, 2022. Since then nearly 2000 projects have been completed and 18,000 volunteers from every state and in 61 countries have signed up to take on a project. There's no charge to the families other than the cost of whatever materials may be needed to finish and shipping both ways, if necessary. They even try to find a finisher who's local so there are no shipping costs.

They began by posting flyers in yarn shops, nursing homes, and libraries. After posting a flyer in Mount Auburn, Washington, the very next day, a young widower walked in, holding a scarf that his late wife had been knitting for him. The owner of the shop gave him the contact information, and he reached out immediately. A finisher took on the project, learned a new stitch, and marked the last stitch his wife had put in, so he would know which were the stitches done by his wife's own hands.

Masey said, "There's something really profound for the finisher in being entrusted with this precious and meaningful work. So for me, helping someone's gesture of love is a way to spread that love even further."
