Maccanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary, Inc.

Located in the most extreme food desert (without a single dedicated grocery store) in the state, and one of the poorest in the country, the MacCannon Brown Homeless Sanctuary impacts 250+ lives per week (two-thirds of them children). They build not only a safety net but real pathways of advancement. They believe our faith is deepened by the experience of mutual transformation.

This past year, more than fifty St Anthony parishioners volunteered for the Friday meal program, fostering a sense of inclusion, value, and dignity.

Family Promise of Waukesha County

Did you know that currently 355 students in Waukesha County are experiencing homelessness? Families put great effort into hiding their homelessness due to the stigma associated with it. Imagine trying to participate at school while experiencing the uncertainty and instability they face.

Through Prevention/Rent Assistance, Shelter, and the Stabilization programming efforts, Family Promise helps families feel God's love and rebuild their lives in a dignified way as they work to transition them to stable housing, reduce vulnerabilities, and realize their true potential.

Over the course of the last year, St Anthony has supported [Family Promise](#) by preparing ~1,000 total servings of food and enjoying fellowship with the nearly 100 unique households that were served by Family Promise in 2022 - and 2023 is on track to be an even greater number of households served.
