

An encouraging improvement in the financial situation in New York is being effected by inquiries for cars, of a varying degree at the different shows.

The thoughts of motorists turned toward the Chicago show, Coliseum and the Importers' Madison Square Garden. The latter is regarded in some of the only truly national shows under the auspices of the National Association of Automobile Manufacturers, and will be open from November 2 to December 1. The year was 1908. The interurban electric railway train begins its run from Dallas to Sherman. A British soldier, Robert Baden-Powell founds the Boy Scout movement, and Pablo Picasso and Georges Braque co-founded the cubism art movement. The first round-the-world automobile race begins in New York. In Detroit, the model T Ford, hailed as the car for the multitudes, is introduced at a price of \$850.00 and will cruise effortlessly at 25 miles per hour. The General Motors Corporation is organized in New Jersey to compete with Ford. An ordinance is passed in New York making it illegal for a woman to smoke in a public place. The New England Methodist Episcopal Conference ends a ban on dancing, card playing, and theater going. In Rome, Pope Pius X declares that the United States is no longer a missionary area. Mechanic Charles Furnas becomes the first passenger on an airplane on a flight with Orville Wright in Dayton, Ohio. In New York, the 47 story Singer building becomes the tallest skyscraper. The International Paper Company develops the first disposable wax coated paper cup which they call "Dixie Cup." The Chicago Cubs defeat the Detroit Tigers four games to one to win the World Series.
