
CHAIR'S NOTE



Hello OLLI friends,

Last newsletter I reported on Steven Pinker's data showing the historical trend in the

decline of war. He next discusses some ideas that I found interesting about what caused the decline. He sights the influence of 18th century writers in denouncing war, along with some "practical suggestions on how to reduce or even eliminate war." One of these suggestions was the idea that commerce and trade would make war less likely, a theory later supported by historical researchers. Democracy was also put forward as a deterrent to war. This theory has empirical support from modern researchers. Pinker also lists the massive destructive power of modern weapons as having a deterrent effect.



Most interesting to me is the reason he thinks is

the biggest single change is the fact that so many countries made war illegal. Nations have agreements that war will lead to economic and military penalties. That war is wrong is the cultural norm today. We take it for granted, but it was not so for most of human history. I am happy to think about the progress the human race has made.

Bent into Shape: The Origami Creations of Mark Dewolf-Ott at the Saginaw Art Museum. My display is in conjunction with the Japanese Woodblock prints from the permanent collection. Both will be on display from August 2, 2019 until Sept 28. My stuff goes up a little earlier, from July 19 until September 28. As far as the large part, they are traditional cranes and dragons. Also flying pigs designed by a guy named Bodo Haag and folded by me. It is the year of the pig in eastern Astrology.

I started when I was about 12 when my neighbor loaned me a book on Origami to keep my mischievous hands busy. I took a break during high school and college and started up again in the 80's when the Japanese Tea House opened. I've been volunteering since then. From there I taught and demonstrated origami to civic groups, STEM days at schools, women's and men's clubs, art museums, national conventions, and of course OLLI.

I've only created one model. Later I found someone else had already come up with the idea. I compare my skills to that of a musician. Other people write the score and I perform or interpret it with my own skills. It's the same with the origami models. Other individuals create the designs and I fold them to the best of my ability.
