Advent is now in full swing. Woodmont is vibrant and active all year but especially during the Christmas season. For 36 years now, Woodmont has been putting on Walk Thru Bethlehem. What first started as a live nativity scene up at South Hall in 1983 put on by our youth (to honor Anne Keith) has grown and evolved into a major community event where thousands walk through the doors of our church to experience what it was like when Christ was born. I want to thank the WTB planning Committee and the many members who are working hard this week to build the village. It is no secret that it takes a LOT of work and hundreds of volunteers to pull this off. Every year, it is a labor of love and an outreach to our community. But the question I always want to lift up is "Why?" Why do we do this? Why do we work so hard to bring the Christmas story to life? Here are a few thoughts:

- Christmas is all about the birth of Christ, the light shining in the darkness and the darkness not overcoming it. In the midst of the secular culture, many will forget why we celebrate Christmas in the first place, and this is a great reminder.
- WTB is a major outreach of our church and a gift that we give to the



Nashville community. Put simply, it is an act of love, generosity, and joy that impacts thousands of people.

- WTB brings our church community together. Our church has grown. We have three different worship services every Sunday, and we don't always get to see each other. WTB is a community-wide event where we can come together, work together, and get to know each other better. This strengthens our faith community.
- Woodmont has a reputation throughout Nashville for hosting this event. We should take great pride in this fact and keep working year after year to make it even better.
- When it's over, we are always glad that we kept the tradition alive. The gratitude expressed by those who come reminds us that this event is a significant part of their Christmas tradition!

Years ago, Phillip Brooks had a powerful experience in the Holy Land on Christmas Eve and wrote these words that would become the famous lyrics to one of our favorite Christmas hymns:

*O little town of Bethlehem,
How still we see thee lie!
Above thy deep and dreamless sleep
The silent stars go by;
Yet in the dark street shineth
The everlasting Light;
The hopes and fears of all the years
Are met in thee tonight.
For Christ is born of Mary,
And fathered all above,
While mortals sleep, the angels keep
Their watch of wondering love.
O morning stars, together
Proclaim the holy birth
And praises sing to God, the King,
And peace to all on earth.*

This is what Christmas is all about. This is why we put on Bethlehem year after year. This is why we celebrate Christmas. Jesus Christ can heal a broken world. He can heal our pain and our divisions. He can bring us the peace that passes understanding. He can make us whole again.

Hope Made Me Do It

I dreamed I was Katie Couric and scored the interview of all interviews with Mary following her momentous encounter with the Angel Gabriel. After an exchange of pleasantries, I got right down to it: “Mary, what were you thinking? Did you have any idea what you were signing up for? Why in the world did you say Yes?” Poised and peaceful, Mary’s reply: “Hope made me do it.”

Deep within us all, under the many layers of our humanity, there is a flicker of hope. Think of it in terms of your own interior pilot light divinely engineered to never go out. God installed the safety valve so that no matter life’s circumstances there would always be a part of you that would never give up on love, healing, miracles, heaven, and especially God. It is the eternal blue flame within that gives you the courage to do really brave and benevolent things in this world.

God will never bully us to do something worthy and beautiful with our lives. The choice is always ours. But God will also never stop giving us opportunities to say, “Yes.” Christmas happened and continues to happen when we agree to birth any amount of goodness into this world. Mary could have said no. Joseph could have said no. John the Baptist could have said no. The innkeeper could have said no. The Magi could have said no. You can say no but expect to live a life much smaller, dimmer and less memorable than the one God is offering you. The reality is we say no to God much more than we say yes. Selfishness, cowardice and fear of the unknown shut us down. But when we do have the courage to act from the “pilot light of hope” within us, and repeat the words of Mary, “Here I am God; let it be with me according to Your plan,” we might actually change a life, a story---the course of history.

The hope is in you and me. We were made to say “Yes.” This Christmas when the Angel Gabriel forces his wing through your door, and you feel the pilot light of hope click on, say “Yes!” Make a move for love. Call the friend whose struggling and give her a nudge of hope, make a love drop of soup to someone facing loss, extend a word of encouragement to the stranger crossing your path with his or her head bowed low, buy the coat and the meal for the homeless man, woman or child, show some mercy to a difficult family member, include, love better, harder and more often. And if anyone comes knocking on your door and asks you “Why?” Just say, “Hope made me do it.”
