




# PROPOSED 2025-2026 BUDGET: \$5,197,277



- Outreach, major components: \$160,000 awarded as cash grants to local non-profit organizations, \$36,000 for the Habitat for Humanity build, \$30,000 given directly to the Disciples Mission Fund, \$20,000 to support Walk Thru Bethlehem, \$30,000 to Mission Trip Scholarships, \$6,000 to The Nashville Food Project, \$7,500 for Fall-Hamilton Elementary, \$1,000 for Disaster Response Travel, and \$1,000 for the Green Street Homeless Ministry.
- Personnel: Three full-time ordained ministers (Clay, Jay, & Roy), two part-time ordained ministers (Farrell & Justin), two full-time Youth Directors (Katie & Abby Akers), a part-time Youth Director (TBA), Children's Ministry Director (Abby McLean), Assistant Children's Minister (Ashley), Young Adults Director (Moriah), Music Director (Michael), Bridge Leaders (Andra & team), Business Administrator (Chris), Communications Director (Matt), A/V Director (Steven), A/V Assistant (TBA), Social Media Coordinator (Nikki), Connections Director (Tammy), Missions Director (Jerry), Center for Hope & Healing Director (Vicki), Executive Assistant (Amber), Administrative Assistant (Jan), part-time Administrative Assistant (TBA), Parish Visitor (Anne), Accompanist (Sarah), Property Manager (Sam), Custodians. Also included in this year's budget are cost-of-living and merit-based raises.
- Property facts: \$163,000 for building repair and maintenance, \$120,000 for electricity, \$100,000 budgeted directly to the Tom Mathias Reserve Fund, \$49,000 for A/C contract, \$49,000 for gas bill, \$70,000 for grounds maintenance, \$30,000 for water and sewer, \$25,000 for telephone and internet. The property budget still includes a contingency line for unforeseen expenditures.

# Proposed Operating Budget


The Woodmont Board met on Thursday evening, May 29, and approved the proposed operating budget that the finance committee has been working on. Our spring stewardship campaign was the largest and most successful one that we have ever had. We had **521 commitments totaling \$4,639,192.**

Thank you to the Barretts and Harrisons for their leadership. The details of the proposed budget can be found in this edition of The Spire. We are proposing an overall budget of \$5,197,277, which is a 12% increase over this past year.

Thank you for your generosity and support that allows Woodmont to keep living its mission and changing lives. Collectively, we are doing big things as a church. The congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, June 22, at 10:40 a.m. in the sanctuary, and Installation Sunday for our new leaders will be on Sunday, June 29, at the 11:00 service. On Sunday, June 15, we will honor all of our fathers and grandfathers at each service.

The Board continues to talk about the future and the priorities identified by our visioning committee. Here are the key areas where we know we have “good challenges” as a church:

**DEMANDS ON DROWOTA HALL** – basketball, pickleball, practices, preschool, breakfasts, dinners, special events, and much more. This space is always in demand.



**YOUTH MINISTRY GROWTH** – As our youth ministry continues to grow and kids move up, the current space that they are in is limited in many ways.

**CHILDREN'S MINISTRY GROWTH** – Our children's and family ministry continue to thrive. Many Sundays, we have way more children in these classrooms than we should. Again, a great problem. Grateful to the many teachers and volunteers we have every week.

**WORSHIP SPACE LIMITATIONS** – Many Sundays throughout the school year, both the 9:30 and 9:40 services are very full. We are continuing to brainstorm the possibility of adding a fourth service and what that might look like. Congregational input has been very important. The livestream has clearly been a way for us to expand our reach and is utilized heavily every week. Woodmont has certainly grown through its media ministries even when space is tight.

**PARKING** – Simply put, we don't have enough parking during the year. Thankfully, Campbell West gives us a place to park 40-60 cars on Sunday and that has become a life saver. We realize that this cannot be a long-term solution.

**CAMPUS FLOW** – with so many people on campus, it can feel crowded and congested. We are very aware of this and are grateful for the shepherds who help us navigate these things every week.

Bottom line, many of Woodmont's challenges are “good” challenges to have. Summer provides a slower pace, and with people traveling, some of these things are alleviated to a degree. Addressing these challenges requires intentional thought, planning, and financial resources. That is what we have been working on in recent months.

Steve Vining, chair of our property committee, has done a great job of identifying upcoming projects that we will need to address over the next one to five years, many sooner than later. This includes the flat roof of Drowota Hall, upgrades to the Gathering Hall, the very outdated restrooms under the sanctuary, and feel of the Narthex. All of these things were discussed by the Woodmont board last week and recommendations have been made. We are making progress in each of these areas.

Thank you for your ongoing support of Woodmont! Thank you for being a part of the church family. Enjoy the slower pace of summer and the renewal that it can bring. We will keep you informed as we continue to address many of these topics. In the meantime, let's all be thankful that we have many of these challenges to solve.

2. Add a letter and a picture of you or your family.

3. Clearly mark the letter with your sponsored friend's full name and Unbound CH# as well as your name so that this will be delivered correctly.

5. Add \$15 cash. We will be purchasing backpacks made by fathers in the Unbound sustainability program. Your gift will go in a backpack and be delivered by Unbound staff in Guatemala.

**5. Drop off your package in the Gathering Space or outside the Bridge on Sunday, June 15th, 22nd or 29th. You can also drop off at the Church office no later than Sunday JUNE 29th.**

6. Your friend will be so happy to receive this. There is no mail, no Amazon, no UPS in most areas of Guatemala so receiving a gift and a letter is truly an exciting event. Our last backpack project was in March 2024, so your friend will be happy to hear from you again.

Tips for sending gifts:

- Send items that your friend would like based on their age and gender. Items from Nashville are fun and appreciated.

- Include a letter from your family and a photo. This is received as a special treasure.

- Small gift ideas include: pens and markers, baseball cap, small games or toys, craft items, comb, toothbrush, bandaids, chapstick, socks, purse, earbuds, yarn, work gloves, reading glasses, sports team t-shirt, stickers.

**No liquids, toothpaste or candy that melts. It must fit in a one gallon baggie!**
