Then Jesus went home, and again a crowd gathered so that he and his disciples were not even able to eat. When Jesus' family and relatives heard about this, they went out to take charge of him, thinking he had lost his mind. The religious scholars who had come down from Jerusalem said, "He is possessed by Beelzebub," and "He casts out demons through the ruler of demons."

Summoning them, Jesus spoke in parables: "How can Satan cast out Satan? If a realm is divided against itself, it cannot last. If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand. And if Satan has suffered mutiny in the ranks and is torn by dissention, the devil is finished and cannot endure. No attacker can enter a stronghold unless the defender is first put under restraint. Only then can the attacker plunder the stronghold."

"The truth is, every sin, failing, and blasphemy the people utter will be forgiven. But those who blaspheme against the Breath of God will never have forgiveness. They are guilty of an eternal transgression." Jesus spoke all this because they said, "He is possessed by an impure spirit."

Jesus' mother and brothers arrived outside and sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting around Jesus and they said to him, "Your mother and brothers are outside looking for you." Jesus replied, "Who is my mother? Who is my family?" And looking around at everyone there, Jesus said, "This is my family! Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my sister, my brother, my sibling, my mother."

A chosen family requires a language for forgiveness as much as one of resistance. In many cases, the relationships I've forged with my friends provide the kinds of nurturing that our families of origin did not provide. Many of us came from homes that informed our cultural upbringing but could not comprehend the parts of us that are queer, different, struggle with mental illness, or lead non-traditional lives. However, we did not completely disregard the idea of family. Rather, we had to unlearn what we had been taught about family in order to model intimacy as a source of possibility in our everyday lives.
